

Break-ins reported

A break-in has left a Nassagaweya store owner thousands of dollars short.

Thieves smashed a window and entered Clover Farm on Guelph Line and No. 15 Sideroad during the evening of November 29 and the morning of December 30.

A large quantity of cigarettes, meat, frozen food, video cassette recorder, cash and lottery tickets were stolen, police say.

Stereo heist

About \$6,500 worth of merchandise was stolen from a Main Street stereo store sometime during the evening of November 28.

Halton Regional Police say the culprits shattered the display window at Sound Man and got away with seven car stereos, four car compact disc players, four amplifiers, an equalizer and a table-top stereo.

Stolen car

A stolen car was recovered during the early morning hours of November 30 after a single vehicle accident on No. 14 Sideroad and Tremaine Road, police say.

A Milton man, two Hamilton men and a Hamilton woman were charged with possession of stolen property in the incident.

Christmas culprits

Four youths were caught Saturday damaging Christmas lights on Syer Drive, police say. The youths were also responsible for a number of other similar incidents in the neighbourhood, according to police.

Police are investigating a cigarette theft which occurred at Shopper's Drug Mart on Main Street Friday.

House break-in

A Moorelands Crescent home was broken into during the evening of November 27. Thieves kicked in the side door and stole a video cassette recorder and colour television worth \$900.
