In mid-June town council passed a no-smoking bylaw, banning smoke ing in municipal buildings, shops and just about anywhere substantial numbers of people gather.

Also in mid-June, two young Milton women, Lorraine Gregory, 20, and Deborah Smith, 19, were killed when their car was hit by one driven by John Lake, 37, of Oakville. Mr. Lake was charged with various offences relating to impaired driving causing death. He was found guilty late in the year and awaits sentencing.

In July Milton Rotary Club members and municipal officials finally the cornerstone for the club's long-awaited affordable housing complex, a 26-unit building, in urban Milton.

In mid-July one route of appeal against the decision to saddle Milton with Halton's landfill was closed when the provincial Cabinet upheld a hearing board decision choosing the town.
