

# Ski snatcher back in action at Glen Eden

Another case of stolen ski equipment was reported at the Glen Eden ski complex at Kelso Conservation Area.

The scenario is typical. Brian McNaughton of Oakville, last Wednesday, went into the chalet at about 2.15 p.m., leaving his ski equipment on the rack.

When he returned a half an hour later, his white and green Atomic Arc skis, valued at \$400, were gone.

## Kids suspected in Georgetown vandalism spree

Two youths not yet in their teens are suspects in a \$6,000 vandalism spree in Georgetown in which police received more than 30 separate complaints.

The streets of Mountainview, Baird Cres., Delrex Blvd., Prince Charles Dr. and Hawks Place were targeted by the two suspects. Windshield wipers were broken, gas caps opened, tires slashed and paint scratched. The culprits entered vehicles, stealing hockey equipment, cellular phones and numerous other items.

A description of the pair, both white males believed to be between the ages of 10 and 12 years of age, was obtained from witnesses interviewed during the investigation. One, the size of an average 12-year-old, was wearing a bomber or ski jacket, dark grey top with a green 'V' separating a light grey bottom, dark jean pants tucked inside calf high boots, and a grey hat. The other, smaller than the first suspect, wore a mid-length coat, blue jean pants, grey hat and was carrying an unknown object.

The incidents took place overnight Friday, Dec. 10, between 3-5 a.m. Investigators believe the youths may have slipped out of their homes without their parents' knowledge.

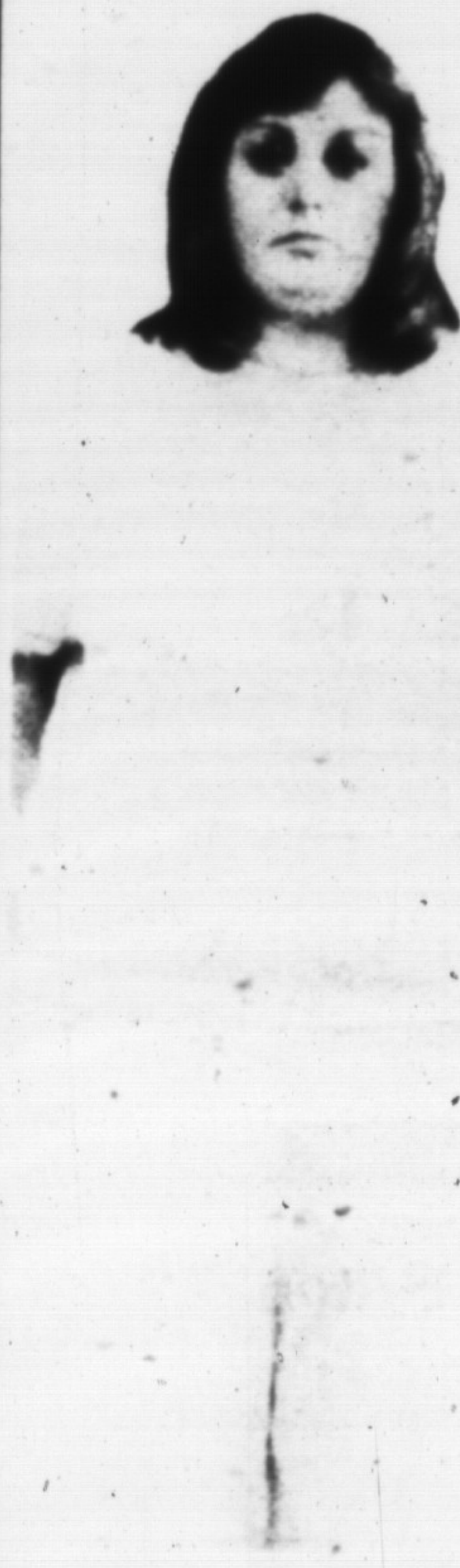
