

Winning comes naturally

The owners of nine properties in Milton will be recognized by Ontario Premier David Peterson tonight for their roles in protecting the environment.

At Nassagaweya Community Centre, Mr. Peterson will present plaques to private landowners who have voluntary agreements with Ontario's Natural Heritage League (NHL) to protect significant natural areas on their properties.

The owners of three other properties in Halton will also receive Niagara Escarpment Natural Heritage Stewardship Awards. Milton winners are: Diane and Stephen Blanchet, Robert and Catherine Cole, Peter and Heather Cook, Douglas and Jean Falls, Claude, Anna and Janine Griffon, Fotini and Dodd Patterson, Horst and Ilsa Sandloehken, John and Lois Swan, and Kenneth and Janet Wood.

Through the Natural Heritage Stewardship Program, private landowners agree to maintain and protect the natural area and provide 90 days notice to the NHL of any threats to the area or plans to sell the property.

Co-hosted by the NHL and the Ontario Heritage Foundation, the ceremony will begin at 8 p.m. As well as the award recipients, invited guests will include local provincial and municipal leaders, NHL representatives and others interested in preserving the natural environment.

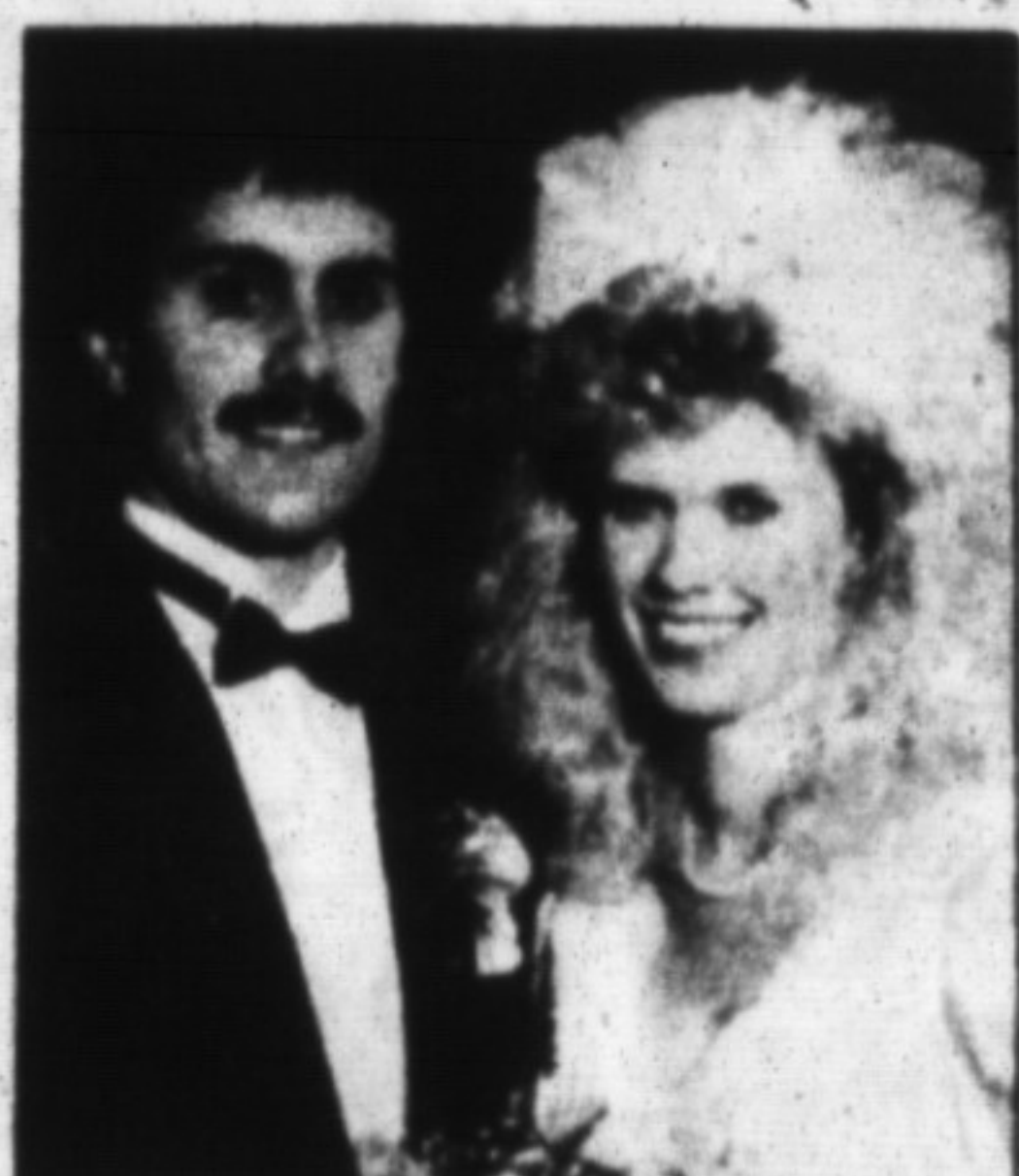
