Acton Villa surprised by Coaches

Oakville kept its perfect season alive in Milton Indoor Soccer action with a 3-0 win over Hi-Five Hair design on the weekend. The Milton Youth Coaches beat second place Acton Villa 3-2 and third place Halton Outdoors lost to Milton Honda 4-2.

After only a minute of the first game of the day Anthony McLauglin of Oakville blasted a shot from the edge of the box to open the scoring. The game remained 1-0 into the second half. Danilo Kozulic hit the post on an unlucky poke which rebounded directly into the arms of Martin Warren the Oakville goal-tender early in the second.

A beautiful play came from Orville Reynolds with a shot off the back wall to Paul Bennion who banged it in for a 2-0 Oakville lead. Hi-Five did not have much luck in the game as a second shot, this time from Andy Garside, hit the post and rebounded to the patient Oakville defence. Oakville managed one more to cap the scoring 3-0.

The second game of the day was a face off between The Dickens and Fearmans. Gary Hudson started the scoring for The Dickens with a fine goal off his own rebound. Matt Szafer of The Dickens potted the next two goals, the first was a fine drive from about 25 feet out while the second was a shot from the side into the corner of the net.

Rick Soder brought the ball up the middle for The Dickens and slipped a pass to Hudson who was waiting to drive the ball past Fearman's goaltender. The Dickens had the total of the play with the only Fearman's goal coming from Ron Wright on a penalty.

A long drive by Soder trickled past the goaltender and made it across the line for a 5-1 Dickens lead. The last goal of the contest came from The Dickens Bob Adamson as he blasted one past the goaltender and a lone defenceman.

The third game of the day was definately the biggest upset as Youth Coaches, a ninth place team prior to the day's action, beat the 9-1-1 Acton Villa 3-2. Villas only loss of the season had come at the hands of powerhouse Oakville.

John Reitman put the Coaches on top with a nice shot that squeaked under the goaltender. Andrew Szafer struck again for the Coaches when he took the ball off the Acton defence to set up his shot.

Paul Nolan then burst the Coaches bubble with a goal for Acton who began to play with the confidence they needed to get back in the game. Szafer popped a marker to restore the two goal margin for the Coaches. Nolan

manged one more goal but too little for the second place Acton Villa who lose 3-2.

Webs United opened the scoring in their contest against Optimist Center. Jim Barries, goal for Webs, was matched by the Optimists Tommy Kane who carried the ball himself, faked the goaltender and chipped it high into the net.

Barrie scored his second to grant Webs a 2-1 lead at the half. Early in the second half Webs' Graham Elder scored a goal on John Dwyer the Optimist goaltender to claim a 3-1 lead. Darrel Connor of Webs and Kane of Optimist Centre traded goals to make the final 4-2 for Webs United.

The final game of the day was a contest between up and down Milton Honda and third place Halton Outdoors. Milton Honda got on the board fast getting a pair of markers from Alex Vukcevik. Rob Holliday scored for Outdoors on a penalty kick but Keyin Griffin fired a shot with eyes as it eluded the maze of legs to catch the twine and restore the two goal margin to Milton Honda.

Carl 'Super' Cooper added a goal with an individual effort true to his name to narrow the margin but Paul Vidovich iced the cake for Milton Honda who claimed a 4-2 win.

Honda has trouble fielding a team but if they can work out their troubles they could be a team to watch in the playoffs.
