



## Seven golds for Drury junior grapplers

Q. If I have to move to attend university, may I deduct the moving expenses?

A. Moving expenses within Canada are deductible, but only from scholarships or from income earned at the new location, not from earnings before you moved. Moving expenses in or out of Canada may be deducted by students but only from certain types of income.

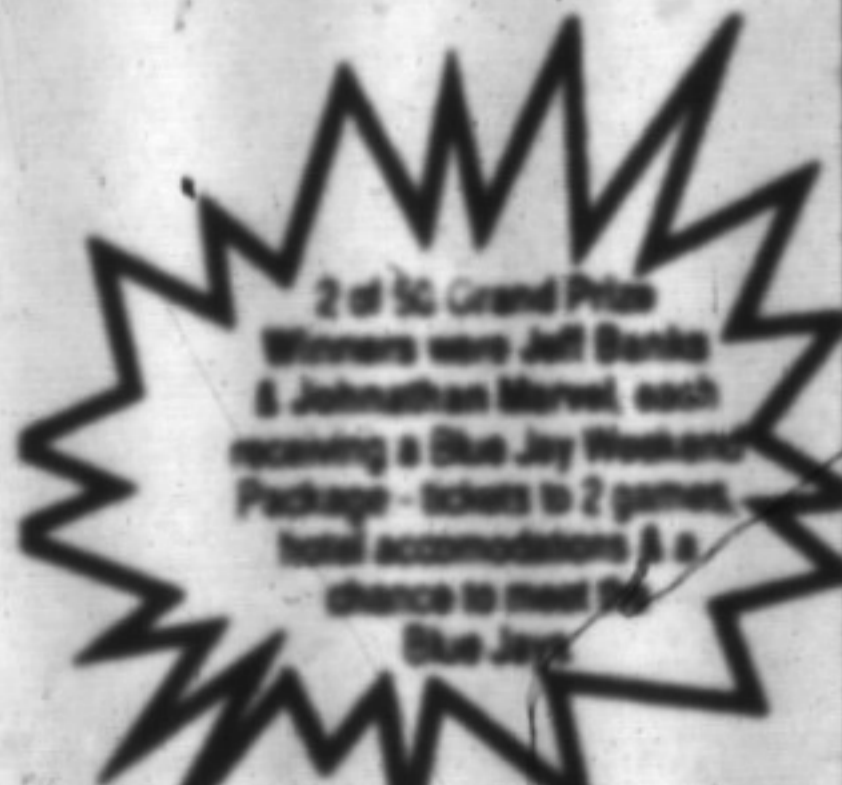
