new facility rather than renovate either of the two existing buildings.

It did so for two reasons — cost and design. The consultants had advised that new homes for the elderly are currently being designed to provide more of a home atmosphere rather than a hospital setting, and that the cost of renovating the two present buildings to meet those standards would be 80 to 90 per cent of the cost of a new building.

The new seniors home will be built on five acres of land in front of the Martin House, with the southern boundary being adjacent to E.C. Drury High School and the western boundary fronting Hwy. 25.

The present facility is approved for 370 beds but when Halton Region went before the ministry to build a similar-sized facility, it found the concept out of vogue. It then came back with a smaller 200-bed facility and a plan to "decentralize" the remainder of the beds to smaller facilities in Burlington and Oakville.

Road improvements

Developers of a Milton community shopping mall will pay for a \$110,000 upgrading of Derry Road.

Southview Mall is being built by Ricenberg Developments on the

northwestern corner of Derry Road and Hwy. 25, and regional staff had requested roadway improvements.

"The construction of the Derry Road widening and entrance, as well as the parking lots is to proceed in May to meet the June opening schedule," development manager Tom Baskerville informed council.

Police budget approved

A 14.9 per cent budget increase for Halton Regional Police won't appeal to the Ontario Police Commission.

Under the current set up, although the regional police force is funded by regional taxes, regional council has little say during the budget deliberations. Instead, a five member board of commissioners (which includes two regional councillors) is responsible for the budget. Council's only route of appeal is to the OPC.

Oakville Councillor John Graham said he refused to support a double-digit increase. However, his motion to appeal the increase lost 14-7.

Many councillors feel the appeal process is suspect. They are upset much of the police budget increase was caused by implementing recommendations from a review which the OPC conducted on the local police force.
