Girls bounce back after tourney loss

The Milton Girls Hockey Team was knocked out of a tournament in Keene after three tough games. They rebounded to claim victory in their last game of the regular season, 2-1 over Brantford.

For the first time the Milton squad was awarded with the Ontario Womens Hockey Association (OWHA) Sportsmanship Plaque for good sportsmanship shown by the players and their fans during the tournament.

Unfortunately that plaque was the only hardware secured by the team which went winless over three games. Milton lost 4-1 to United Counties as they were never able to get on track. Only excellent goaltending by Kelly Picard kept the score close. Kerry Gale popped the lone Milton marker with assists going to Jamie Picard and Kim Lee.

Milton produced a far better effort in the second contest. A goal from Paula Haringa off a pass from sister Karen knotted the score 1-1 which held through regulation time. When an overtime period failed to produce a winner the rules stipulated that both goaltenders be pulled. Peterborough pilfered the contest with a goal into the empty Milton net.

The third game against Ottawa was a well played contest by both squads but Milton could not find the net and lost 2-0.

Early last week the team finished the regular season with a 2-1 win against Brantford. Anita Mastracci scored on a pass from Kim Hagen. Mastracci returned the favour and set Kim up for Milton's second goal. Melanie Hewitson and Jamie Picard also collected assists.

Milton finished the season with a 12-5-3 record which is good enough for second place in their league. The team's goaltenders managed seven shutouts and a 1.20 goals against average with 44-24 for and against goal totals.

In their first playoff contest Milton was held scoreless against Brantford but managed a tie 0-0 as their defence held firm.
