

Sherratt girls' basketball team captures North Halton title

The Sam Sherratt girls basketball team captured the North Halton Tier I championship for the second consecutive year with a 27-15 win over W.I. Dick last week.

Michelle Maynard, Sherratt's outstanding guard, played a key role in the win with a career high 16 points. Maynard opened the scoring with three perfectly executed jumpshots in the first few minutes to stake Sherratt to a solid lead.

Both defences clicked in after the initial flurry and baskets became dif-

ficult to obtain. The larger laying surface at Milton District High School, and the glass backboards added to the scoring difficulty for both teams.

W.I. Dick narrowed the margin to within six points at half time but Sherratt maintained their poise and widened the gap to 12 by the final buzzer.

W.I. Dick entered the final with a 7-2 regular season record to their credit. Both losses came at the hands of crosstown rival Sherratt which

finished with a perfect 10-0 record. In semifinal action, Sherratt (10-0) played Centennial (4-6) and W.I. Dick (7-2) faced Brookville (4-5).

Sherratt had no difficulty advancing to the North Halton finals with a one-sided victory over Centennial and W.I. Dick doubled the score on Brookville 30-16 to advance to the final.

Alicia Gunn fired more than 20 points for Sherratt in both games against W.I. Dick during the regular season to pace a strong offence.

Shannon Prevost of W.I. Dick was charged with the job of keeping the ball out of Gunn's possession.

Prevost impressed everyone including her coach Fred Ross by holding Gunn to only one basket in each of the first three quarters and four points in the final quarter. Unfortunately Prevost's emphasis on defence throughout the contest prevented her from adding much to her team's offensive totals.

Maynard picked up the slack for Sherratt but W.I. Dick could not match her accurate shooting despite a large number of chances.

Both teams qualify for the finalist round which will put them on the path to the Halton County finals.

W.I. Dick will face Brookdale and then Central with wins in both games necessary to advance to the Halton semifinals against Q.E. Park of Oakville.
