Closer to home

Aimco must fight to grow

As far as receiving shipments from all over Canada, Mr. Hesse said "we don't really intend to bring materials in from all over the country. Generally, all we're really trying to do is serve the area."

Without elaborating, Mr. Hesse said the Ministry of the Environment had urged the company to include the nation-wide provision.

Mr. Hesse added that Aimco Solrec's expansion plans do not include dealing with PCB waste. "We have not asked for or are interested in receiving PCBs."

Mr. Hesse said he expects the entire approval process to take another three to four months.

Aimco Solrec ran into trouble with the Ministry of the Environment in

May of 1989 when a shipment of solvents to be burned as fuel in Michigan was returned to the company by U.S. authorities after testing positive for PCB contamination. The company pleaded guilty to two charges laid by the Ministry and paid a \$50,000 fine.

The tainted shipment was returned to Aimco Solrec and 8,000 gallons of solvents contaminated to some extent with PCBs are stored at the Milton facility because in Canada it is almost impossible to discard such a commodity.

The storage has provoked pointed political criticism at various levels.

Although the Ministry of the Environment pressed prosecution of Aimco Solrec on two counts, the company was originally charged with six offences, with the other four charges being dropped. Ministry officials also praised the firm's efforts in meeting new MOE guidelines for plant operation.

Mr. Hesse noted that the firm installed \$35,000 worth of PCB detection equipment, which also costs \$100,000 per year to operate.

The truck which brought the PCB laced solvents to Aimco Solrec for processing in 1989 had made five collection stops enroute to the Milton plant.

Government investigators questioned all five Aimco Solrec customers in an attempt to determine who had allegedly dumped the PCB contaminated solvents at Aimco Solrec's facility. But the investigation was dropped, Mr. Hesse said, due to the lack of conclusive evidence.

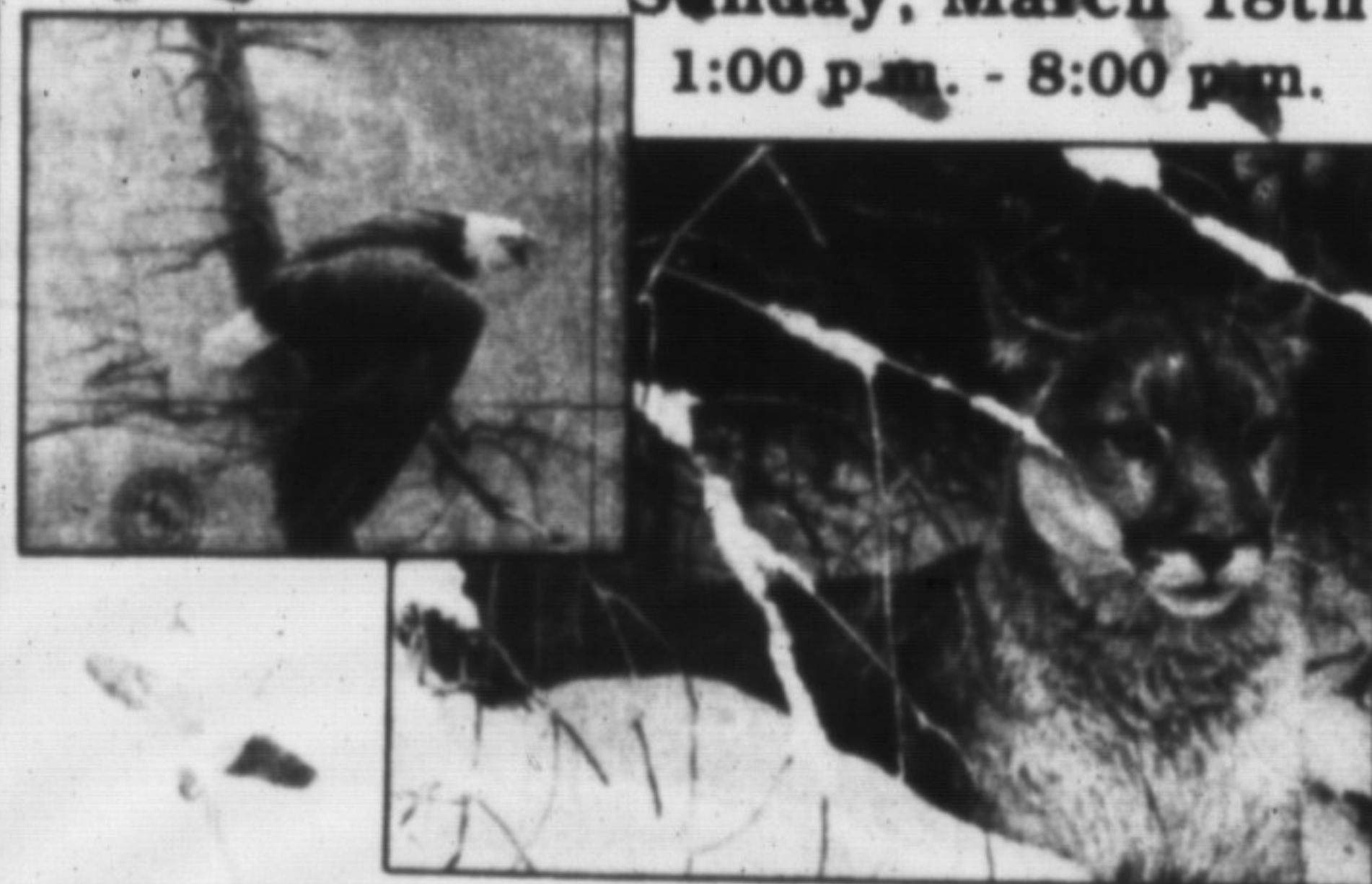
