At Tech Olympics

Drury finishes first in skills fair

Seven Milton high schools students won first place honours at the third annual Halton Technical Olympics at E.C. Drury High School last week.

They will continue on to the regional competition on Saturday, Apr. 21 at Mohawk College's Saltfleet campus. Winners there progress to the United States Skills Olympics in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

E.C. Drury students overshadowed their Milton District High School counterparts at the competition, taking five individual awards for first place and four team plaques while Milton District competitors won two individual first place plaques and two top team awards.

The winning students from Milton District High School were Neil Hanison for auto mechanics and Chris Armstrong in precision wiring. The five first place win-

ners from E.C. Drury were; Sean Wardle for cabinetmaking, Kathleen Sheppard for hairdressing, Doug Coplin for residential wiring, Mark Zeckel for chef's training and Richard Conway for baking.

Milton District won the team plaques for auto mechanics and precision machinery while the awards for hairdressing, residential wiring, chef's training and baking went to E.C. Drury.

More than 220 students from 17 Halton secondary schools participated in the 15 different events. Students were judged by panels of between three and five industry representatives.

"Without the help that the industries have given, these events could not have been done," said Tony Cafazza, coordinator for Ontario Skills Competitions, the non-profit group which created such events across the province.
