

# Contestants can come clean with energy efficient prizes

Ontario Hydro and this newspaper are offering Milton residents a chance to come clean. And when they do, they can also help clean up the environment.

The utility that lights up our lives is sponsoring an energy use awareness contest and offering five energy efficient shower heads as prizes. Contestants need only fill out the quiz below.

Ontario Hydro predicts that by the year 2014 the demand for electrical power in Ontario will increase by 50 to 100 per cent.

Canadian can comfortably conserve electricity by as much as 25 per cent, Hydro

contends. That effort would mean fewer new generating stations, less harm to the environment and competitive energy pricing.

Electricity isn't the only resource we expect at our fingertips, water is another. Water covers 75 per cent of the earth's surface, but only two per cent of that is fresh water.

Canadians use slightly more water in the home than our industrial, commercial and public sectors combined, with showers accounting for approximately 32 per cent of home use. We use approximately six times more water than the British, and 10 times more than the Swiss.

There are many things Canadians can do in their homes to help conserve energy and water without sacrificing comfort.

Changing your shower head to an energy efficient one reduces use between 30 and 60 per cent, depending on the model. If energy efficient shower heads were installed in only 50,000 homes in Ontario, the energy savings would supply a town of 1,200 for a year.

A five-minute shower with an energy efficient shower head only consumes about 20 litres of hot water, compared to the approximately 54 litres used in a conventional shower head.

The new energy efficient shower head pays for itself in energy and water savings in six months to a year. Available at most hardware, department, plumbing and bathroom fixture stores, the shower heads can be purchased for \$12 to \$60. The price is slightly higher if extra features are specified.

Installation of the new models is simple; just unscrew your old shower head and screw on your new one.
