**Scam artist
not one of
boss's buddies**

There is good and bad news regarding scams against the Milton business community.

The good news is that a warrant has been issued for a quick-change artist who police say has hit several area stores. A quick change artist works by trying to confuse a store clerk into giving more than the required change.

The bad news is that another scam was successfully pulled off against a Milton gas bar attendant, netting the perpetrator \$120.

Here's how it worked: The suspect walked into a Sunoco station on Steeles Avenue last week and told the attendant his car had broken down and he needed money — which the employee's boss would most certainly agree to provide since they were good friends.

The suspect handed over a set of car keys as a sign of good faith and encouraged the attendant to let him talk to the store manager over the phone. The employee rang the boss, and immediately handed the phone over to the suspect.

What the attendant heard was a jovial conversation between two old buddies. However, what really happened was that the suspect had hung the phone up and was 'acting' into a dead receiver.

The attendant fell for it, however, and handed over \$120.

Sergeant Frank Phillips of Halton Regional Police recalled that the same ruse was pulled a few years ago in Halton Hills.

The obvious way to halt the scam, he added, would be for an employee to confirm the arrangements with the boss.

**Tornadoes can
kill in Ontario**

Tornadoes are a regular threat in Ontario, battering the province as many as 25 times a year. In the last nine years 27 Ontario residents have been killed by the storms and \$500 million in property damage has been caused.

April has been declared "Severe Weather Month" in Halton to raise awareness of the savage storms and precautions to take against them.

Overall, Ontario tornadoes occur mainly in the southeastern areas. But in Halton severe weather strikes from the southwest, generally from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m.

Environment Canada raises the alarm when weather might threaten public safety. Alarms are broadcast over both radio and television and come in two degrees: a severe weather watch and a severe weather warning.

A severe weather watch is issued up to six hours in advance to alert the public that a severe thunderstorm is anticipated, which may be accompanied by a tornado. A severe weather warning is issued when dangerous storms are imminent.

The following are some of the precautions to take if such a storm is approaching:

- Stay away from windows, doors and outside walls and protect your head.
- For maximum safety, go down a basement or seek shelter under a stairway or sturdy table, or in a closet.
- Try to reach the centre of the house or the side away from the storm.
