GENERAL NOTES

1. The 1989 financial report consolidates the operations, assets and liabilities of the Town and its local boards and municipal enterprises a follows: Milton Public Library Board and The Board of Management of the Milton Downtown Business Improvement Area.

2. The financial highlights presented have been basically extracted from the audited 1989 Consolidated Financial Report of the Town and its local boards as described in Note 1. The terminology contained in the Consolidated Financial Report has been modified and expanded in order that you might appreciate more fully the nature of our operations.

4. The only Municipal Enterprise whose revenues and expenditures have not been consolidated is the Milton Hydro-Electric Commission.
