Heart worm is canine killer

Your best friend's life could be at risk this summer and you could do something to save it.

Dr. Larry Wilder, a spokesman for the Canadian Veterinary Medical Association, warns that heartworm disease in dogs is on the rise.

The disease is transmitted by contaminated mosquitoes that leave behind microscopic worm larvae with their bites.

The larvae migrate through tissue for several months and eventually travel to the heart where they mature into worms.

The worms can impair blood flow and damage major organs and in some cases the condition may be fatal.

Dr. Wilder suggests dog owners see their veterinarian for information on preventative medicine and other methods to protect both your dog and other dogs in the area.
