

Ken Campbell writing a book to cover his church's legal bills

Former Pastor Ken Campbell of the Emmanuel Baptist Church plans to write a book to offset the legal costs of the church's court battle against the Toronto Star.

In a letter to Sid Jones, chairman of the church's board, Mr. Campbell claimed that in June 1988 the Toronto Star newspaper published an "injurious news report characterized by inaccuracies, innuendo and slander"

As a result, Mr. Campbell launched a personal law-suit against The Star. The church board then recommended the church become a legal party to that lawsuit. This recommendation was endorsed by the church membership.

Mr. Campbell has now decided to discontinue this action and he has recommended that the board do so for a variety of reasons. Mr. Campbell explained that since the lawsuit was filed, The Star published a fur-

ther and more detailed correction of the inaccuracies and innuendos contained in the offending report" he further noted that "to continue this action may well constitute a damaging drag on the capacity of my successor, Pastor Braun."

Mr. Campbell will be publishing

his book God Must Have Sent You Here in order to compensate for the legal costs that were assumed by the church for participating in this legal

He will direct the proceeds from the sale and distribution of the first edition (5,000 copies) of his book.
