

W.I. Dick track team second at Burlington Invitational

The W.I. Dick Wildcats celebrated their 10th anniversary of competition in the Burlington Invitational Relays at Nelson Stadium with a second place finish on Friday night.

The school's best previous points total of 72.5 set in 1980 was surpassed this time around with a score of 77 points for the meet.

The Wildcats set the tone for the evening in the initial race, a medley relay of 800, 400, 400 and 800 metres for junior boys.

The Wildcat team of Daryl Milec, Chris Browning, Corey Tiede and Russell Fleming established a new meet record of 7:06.4 and shattered the old record by more than 14 seconds.

Wildcat coach Fred Ross established practice times with each run-

ner which should have enabled the team to run the race in 7:08. Milec ran a perfectly timed 2:32 first 800 metres.

Chris Browning followed with a 1:04 400 metres for a 1,200 metre elapsed time of 3:36.

A slightly slower 1:07 lap by Tiede required Fleming to improve on the predetermined time of 2:28 for the final 800 metres.

Fleming ran an excellent race. He had a 20 metre lead at the start of his segment so his only competition was the clock in the Wildcat attempt at the record.

He managed a personal best time of 2:23.

The senior boys team of David Bean, Adam Flatt, Scott Boudreau and Shawn Holloway turned in a

7:03 medley time to take fourth place.

The junior boys 4 x 100 team of Deryk Heraux, Fleming, Browning and anchor Thomas Lofthouse ran 53.7 seconds to place second.

The 4 x 100 B team of Tiede, Matt McIntosh, Alex Downs and Ron Hanagan picked up two points with a sixth place finish in a respectable time of 56.41.

Third place crests were earned in the junior boys 4 x 200 event as Heraux, Hanagan, McIntosh and Lofthouse combined to run 1:55.5 for a third place.

The 4 x 400 junior boys team of Tiede, Fleming, Milec and Browning brought home their second first place award of the night as they ran a 4:21.0. The boys junior team tallied

36 points for the Wildcats, almost half their 77 point total.

The senior boys 4 x 400 team of Nolan Milec, Flatt, Bean and Hol-

laway finished off the night with a third place run of 4:4.9. David Bean ran a personal best of 1:00.5 on his 400 metre lap.

Wildcats relay teams show well in Halton senior meet at Nelson

The W.I. Dick Middle School intermediate boys relay team came within a third of a second of placing first in all three races they entered at the Halton County Senior Schools Relay Meet at Nelson Stadium in Burlington on May 17.

The team of Deryk Heraux, Russell Fleming, Chris Browning and Thomas Lofthouse won the 4 x 100 event in a time of 53.8 seconds.

Then Browning and Fleming combined with Matt McIntosh and Darryl Nolec to win the 4 x 400 race in a time of 4:22.43.

The school's 4 x 400 junior girls team crushed Brant Hills School's team by more than 12 seconds to claim a gold medal. The intermediate girls team finished a distant fourth with a 5:05.90 time in the 4 x 400 relay to a

speedy Rolling Meadows School squad which posted a 4:48.30 time.

Heraux and Lofthouse ran a 4 x 100 mixed relay with Kelly Williams and Briar Ross to finish a very close second in a timed final. Their 57.03 seconds set a new W.I. Dick record for the event.

The senior boys 4 x 400 team of Corey Tede, Adam Flatt, David Bean and Shawn Holloway placed second in their event with a time of 4:17.9.

The junior boys 4 x 400 team of Jim Leworthy, Andrew Sharpe, Jim Ellison and Justin Lynch placed fourth.

Twenty-four senior schools were represented in the meet, which covered 15 events.

There were 329 teams running in the 58 heats necessary to declare winners.

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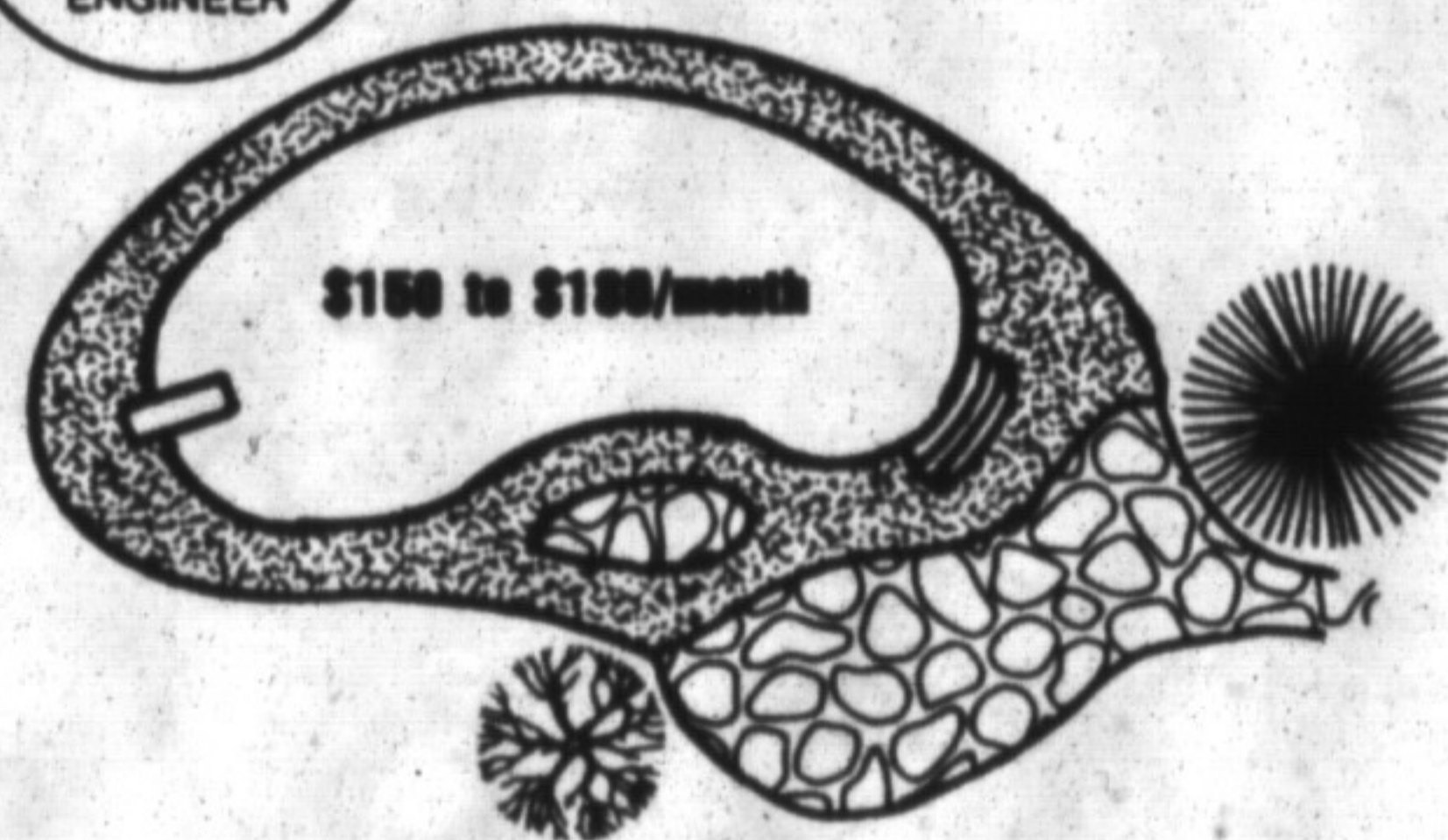
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
