Narcotics stolen in drug store break-in

For the fourth time this year, the Derry Dispensary has been broken into and narcotics stolen.

By the time Halton Regional Police arrived on the scene - a short time after receiving the alarm at 11:55 p.m. last Sunday night — the culprits had already fled.

Police found the back door pried open. Further investigation revealed more than 30 containers of narcotics valued at approximately \$2,000 stolen, along with a small amount of

Unfriendly act

Police are investigating an incident in which a 20-year-old Milton woman, driving a Trans Am along Britannia Road, was harrassed by occupants of another vehicle.

The woman told police she was travelling westbound when another vehicle pulled extremely close. As both vehicles approached Highway 25, one of the suspects rolled down

Police say no pursuit was involved and the suspect was picked up a short time after the incident at an Ontario Street residence.

Plestid fined in fatal accident

Thomas Plestid, 54, of Milton has been fined \$500 for his involvement in an accident which claimed the life of a fellow Milton resident.

In addition to the fine, Mr. Plestid, of Woodward Ave., was directed by provincial court Judge Douglas Latimer on May 22 to perform 175 hours of community service work. He was also put on probation for 18 months.

Mr. Plestid pleaded guilty in April to a charge of careless driving. On March 31, 1989, August Wilchinski, 61, of Moorelands Crescent was westbound in his car on Lower Base Line. At the intersection with Sixth Line, a northbound pick-up truck driven by Mr. Plestid struck the car on the driver's side, court has been told.

Later that afternoon, Mr. Wilchinski was pronounced dead at Milton District Hospital. Mr. Plestid suffered major injuries in the accident.



Armed bank robber sought

A Burlington bank heist is being investigated by Halton Regional Police.

On May 11, just after 11 a.m., a suspect entered the Royal Bank at the corner of New Street and Walkers Line, handing the teller a note written on a

blank deposit slip.

Producing a white plastic bag and a black handgun with a four to five inch barrel, the suspect told the teller, "give me your money."

When the teller responded that the money was in the central cage, the suspect vaulted the counter by the wicket, walked over, and pointed the gun, again asking a teller to hand over the money.

After the teller placed some money in the plastic bag, the robber leaped back over the counter.

He then walked from the bank to a car parked on the west side of the building and fled the scene. The car was a chocolate brown, four door 1988- 89 Oldsmobile Cutlass, described as being very dirty.

The suspect is described as a 170 cm. (five foot, seven inch) white male with a slim build in his late 20's who has well groomed, black wavy hair.


