



NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE Take notice that the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Milton intends to designate the exterior of the house only, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural value under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1980, R.S.O. Chapter 337. Municipal Address:

East half of Lot 21, Concession 5, former Township of Nassagaweya, now in the Town of Milton, R.R. No. 2, Rockwood, owned by Dagmar Gorayeb, Jutta Wollweber (Schubert).

REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION: Built in 1890, the Schubert residence at R.R. #2, Rockwood, is a typical example of the traditional stone farmhouse in terms of overall design. It is in the design of the windows that the house displays its unusual characteristics. Incorporating windows of Romanesque, Gothic and Perpendicular design all in a single facade, it is a veritable textbook of rural domestic styles. The paired windows with Romanesque arches, and "pendant" keystones, however, appear to be quite unique to the Region.

Any persons may, within thirty (30) days of the first publication of this Notice, send by Registered Mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Milton, notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a Notice of Objection is received, the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Milton shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a Hearing.
