

Portraits of nature's panorama

This week's selection of books from the Milton Public Library demanded that I go beyond their jackets and discover the wonders within. They are the grown-ups' answer to children's picture books.

Rather than repeat myself, I'll tell you right now that the photographs in all of these books are beautiful, fascinating, exciting, amazing. But I won't go on. You get the idea.

Unless you are an avid scuba diver, you are not likely to plunge into the depths of the one, continuous interlocking sea that floods seven-tenths of our planet. The National Geographic Society's The Ocean Realm takes you around the world - or rather under the world - to the mountains, valleys, plains and forests. Earth's ocean wilderness is something to behold.

Six hundred miles off the coast of Ecuador lie the Galapagos Islands. First made famous by Darwin's exploration in 1835, David W. Stedman and Steven Zousmer take us in discovery. Steadman's artist brother,

Lee, accompanied them to study the wildlife, the result of which is the first field guide to the Galapagos with 51 watercolour plates.

Lee Steadman's first impression of the Galapagos was "an unqualified jolt", he says. Expecting a little 'tropical enchantment", he found instead an "unrelieved vista of charred volcanic rock"

Whenever I think of China, I visualize a country seething with humanity, with not a bit of land to spare. How wrong I was.


Chinese journalist and naturalist Tang Xiyang reveals to us the Living Treasures he found in China's nature reserves, of which there are more than 300, stretching over hundreds of Galapagos on a modern voyage of thousands of acres in five different climatic zones. The People's

Republic of China made a long-term commitment 30 years ago to establish these reserves to protect rare plant and animal species and unusual geological sites.

Sir David Attenborough considers the Mediterranean area The First Eden. Initially, Sir David saw the book as a natural history, but as the project evolved, more and more archeology and history crept in as the author attempted to describe how our attitude to the natural world, and our treatment of it, has changed over the centuries and has produced the living communities we see today.

"Great God! This is an awful place". Those were the words of Captain Robert Scott. This observation, no doubt echoed by so many other explorers, did not in any way discourage a few thousand men from undertaking some 300 hazardous expeditions to Antarctica.

Antarctica, published by Reader's Digest, tells the many stories of the victories and heartaches that accompanied the explorers to this vast con-
