If you see Mayor Gord Krantz wandering around Town Hall blindfolded Wednesday, don't worry.

It's all for the sake of National Access Awareness Week, which begins Sunday.

The Mayor will join Town councillors, staff and Champion reporter Norman Nelson in discovering the difficulties disabled people often face when facilities are not accessible to

"It's also to celebrate improvements

that have been made for disabled people," said Marlene Schrock who, with the help of the Ontario March of Dimes, is organizing activities in north

Starting at 9 a.m. Wednesday, Mayor Krantz and other volunteers will simulate disabilities by travelling around Town Hall in wheelchairs and wearing blindfolds.

"This is a week with a broad vision," he said. "We all have good reason to be involved. It is concerned with many types of disabilities and many


types of barriers."




