Mallalieu surrenders NRS franchise

In a move being painted by the dealmakers as wholly positive but one guaranteed to make doomsayers proclaim the wolves of recession are howling at the door, one of Milton's real estate companies is closing.

NRS Millpond Realty Inc., a National Real Estate Service franchise owned by Mark Mallalieu, has struck a deal with Realty World broker Jack McCrudden in which Mr. Me-Crudden employs the NRS agents and sublets the NRS offices.

There is some confusion as to the intended fate of the Milton NRS franchise. In an interview Monday Mr. Mallalieu said it "probably won't be here" soon but "someone else might take it over," that is, buy it from Mr. Mallalieu. "I don't necessarily want to see it go down the tubes."

While Mr. Mallalieu may be contemplating that sale, however, Mr. McCrudden said it is not an option. "Our agreement will curtail that

Realty World and NRS Millpond have been drifting toward a deal for the last year at least, both principals acknowledged. Mr. Mallalieu also runs a property management firm and - see REAL on page 3

Firey 401 crash claims local truck driver

A firey crash that resulted in the closure of both east and west bound lanes of Highway 401 in Mississauga for several hours early last Saturday evening has claimed the life of a 26year-old Milton man.

Port Credit OPP said a Mac truck cab driven by Steve Howard, an employee of Sandstone Transport in Milton, was westbound on the 401, one km east of Mississauga Road, when it was in collision with a 1985 Ford Tempo.

Following the collision, the tractor struck the centre median, rolled over, and burst into flames. The driver was pronounced dead at the

The two occupants of the other car - both from Switzerland - received minor injuries. The accident is still under investigation.
