Rockwood artist reflects on the past

One of Ontario's foremost artists will be featured this summer in the gallery at the Halton Hills Cultural Centre.

An exhibition of works by Rockwood sculptor Andreas Drenters will open tonight at a gala hosted by the Friends of the Libraries. The exhibition will remain in the gallery until July 28

Following a family tradition of rural creativity, Mr. Drenters has completed a number of new wall hangings — many assembled from iron found objects and stone, copper and wood.

Railroad spikes, horse shoes, axes, buggy parts and pitch forks are all used to create memorable pieces of sculpture reflecting the artist's life experience and rural heritage.

Mr. Drenters lives and works in the historic Rockwood Academy, restored by the late artist Yosef Drenters, his older brother. It was made famous in the movie Agnes of God which was filmed there.

A retrospective of Yosef's work is currently featured at the Macdonald Stewart Art Centre in Guelph. In their early years both men were influenced and guided by their father. Joseph, a gifted inventor, blacksmith, artist and teacher.

A member of the Sculpture Society of Canada, Andreas Drenters' work has been widely exhibited and is currently included in many public and private collections.

During the opening gala at the Georgetown gallery, Halton Hills Mayor Russ Miller will officially open the summer exhibition. Professor Chandler Kirwin of the University of Guelph, will also take part in the program.

Following the opening, the exhibition can be viewed during regular summer library hours, Tuesday through Saturday. The facility is located at 9 Church St.
