**Town bursting with July 1 fun**

Canada Day won't end with the final blast of fireworks following Sunday night's concert, a moment of the local celebration will live on for the first 1,000 festivity participants.

In keeping with the environmental theme of the July 1 celebration, 1,000 packets of blue spruce seeds will be given away. Children who take part in the fun and games at Rotary Park will receive buttons carrying the slogan "Conservation — Our gift for the future."

As many as 6,000 Miltonians are expected to take part in the day's activities — organized by the Town of Milton leisure services department — between the opening ceremonies at 1:30 p.m. and the concert featuring Brotherline from 8-10:30 p.m.

There have been some new twists added this year for the children, including a visit by balloon artist Mr. Twist. Barb Robb, events co-ordinator for the Town, says the department's summer staff will run a "playground wonderland", complete a shaving cream sculpture contest, water balloon toss, egg-in-spoon races and a few more surprises.

These events will be centered at Rotary Park where a strolling magician, minstrel and tiny pygmy goats can be seen throughout the day.

Things get rolling at 1:30 p.m. with the official opening, followed by the singing of *O Canada* with assistance from Milton Choristers. A giant birthday cake is being supplied by Springridge Farm, with strawberries from the pick-your-own farm as a main ingredient.

After devouring the cake the crowds can move onto a barbecue and beer garden, enjoy a free swim at the outdoor pool, witness trees being planted at the Mill Pond at 2:30 p.m., listen to a Dixieland clown band and visit the environmental awareness display on the banks of the pond.

Local entertainment will be featured at Rotary Park all afternoon. At 2:15 and at 5 p.m. members of local service clubs will prove you can fight Town Hall but they'll do it on the softball field.

There will be bingo from 1:30-4:30 p.m. in the park and a dunking

booth operating at the same time. The Milton Springers and Milton School of Jiu-Jitsu strut their stuff between 2-3:30 p.m.

The local federal Progressive Conservative association is supplying Canadian flags, balloons and pins until 4:30 p.m.

To end the birthday party there will be a fireworks display at the Mill Pond starting at 10:15 p.m. Eat some popcorn care of Milton Jaycees and enjoy the show under the stars.

Canada Day will also be celebrated at the Ontario Agricultural Museum and Halton Region Museum.

**Province will appeal Sunday shopping rules**

While the courts may have decided that people can shop on Sundays, the Province is still hoping to have it considered a sin.

Last Friday, the Ontario Supreme Court overturned the Province's Sunday and holiday closing legislation.

However, earlier this week, the Province appealed that decision and today is slated to appear before the courts requesting that the Retail Business Holidays Act continue to be upheld pending an appeal.

If the request (it's called a stay) is granted, explained Halton Region solicitor Mark Meneray, then presumably it will be business as usual — the Region continuing to allow Sunday openings only under its tourism-related guidelines, and Halton Regional Police again enforcing the legislation.

If the Province fails with the appeal, he conceded, any charges filed during the appeal period would be tossed out of court.

He wouldn't comment on what he thought the Province's chances are of obtaining the stay, but remarked: "Let's just say the Attorney General (Ian Scott) is confident he'll get it."

If the stay is granted, Halton Region has decided to proceed with a public meeting August 22 to consider a request by Culotta Wines of Oakville to open Sundays.
