Fair Continued: Rainy weather kept profits down for the annual Strawberry Fair fundraiser for Milton District Hospital Auxiliary and this weekend the auxiliaries hope to pick up the slack. They'll have a booth at the downtown Farmers' Market Saturday morning (July 7) that will feature sweaters they've knitted as well as many items from the hospital gift shop. The market runs each Saturday from 7 a.m. to noon on Main Street which is closed to traffic for the morning.

Underwater Discovery: Secrets of the ancient Indian Village at Crawford Lake Conservation Area were revealed through the lake's bottom. Visitors to the property this Sunday (July 8) will discover through slide shows and a hike how the lake contributed to the reconstruction of the Indian village. The slide shows run at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. in the interpretive centre. Hikes start after the 2 p.m. showing. Interpreters are available to provide information at the Indian village and the kids' room is open for making crafts which children can take home. Crawford Lake, located on Guelph Line at Steeles Avenue is open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily.

Classical Concert: The pipe organ at Ebenezer United Church in Nassagaweya will be heard along with the renderings of acclaimed musicians on Sunday, July 8 for "Music for a Summer Evening". The classical concert that starts at 7:30 p.m. will feature Nassagaweya resident Daniel Warren on trumpet, Dr. Peter Hardwick, organ; Joanne Hiscocks, flute; and soprano Anita Maria Ruthig. There will be wagon rides, musical entertainment, demonstrations, strawberry eating contests, face painting and haystack jumping. 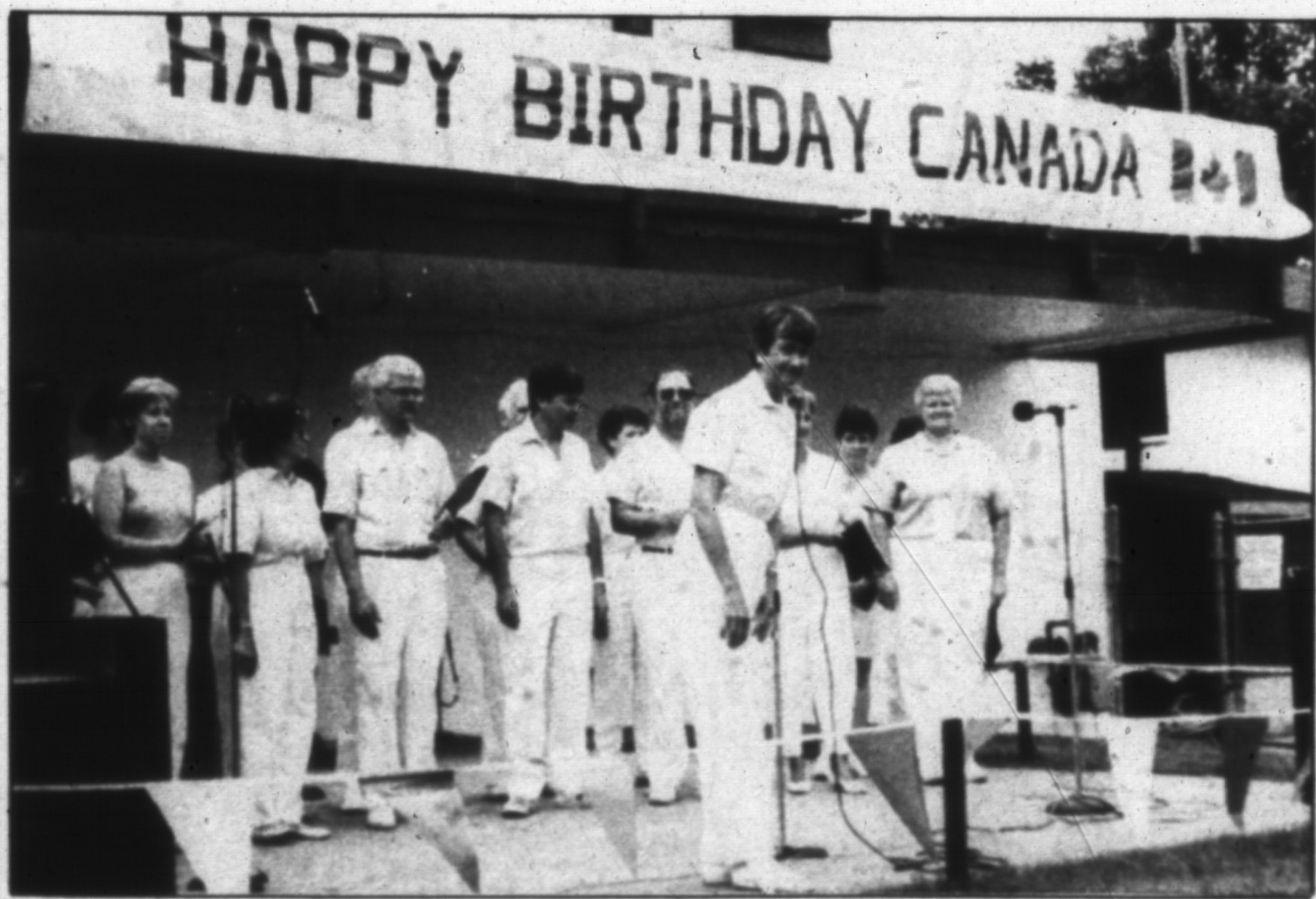
