

Halton police crack down on sidewalk cyclists

Halton Regional Police are warning Milton residents not to ride their bikes and skateboards on downtown sidewalks.

Complaints from merchants and pedestrians afraid of being injured by the fast-moving vehicles have prompted police to respond to the problem, says village constable Larry Masson.

Because Main Street lanes are both busy and narrow, says constable Masson, cyclists tend to ride on the sidewalks.

But a Town of Milton bylaw passed in 1985 prohibits it. The maximum penalty is a \$100 fine.

"The problem is the streets are so narrow. I wouldn't want to ride a bike on Main Street myself," adds constable Masson.

He suggests cyclists walk their bikes when travelling downtown and skateboarders ride elsewhere.

A sign reminding residents of the bylaw is posted at the corner of Main and Martin streets, but it hasn't curbed the problem, he says.

Police officers, patrolling downtown on foot, are currently on the look out for offenders, he warns. Similar action last summer reduced the problem.

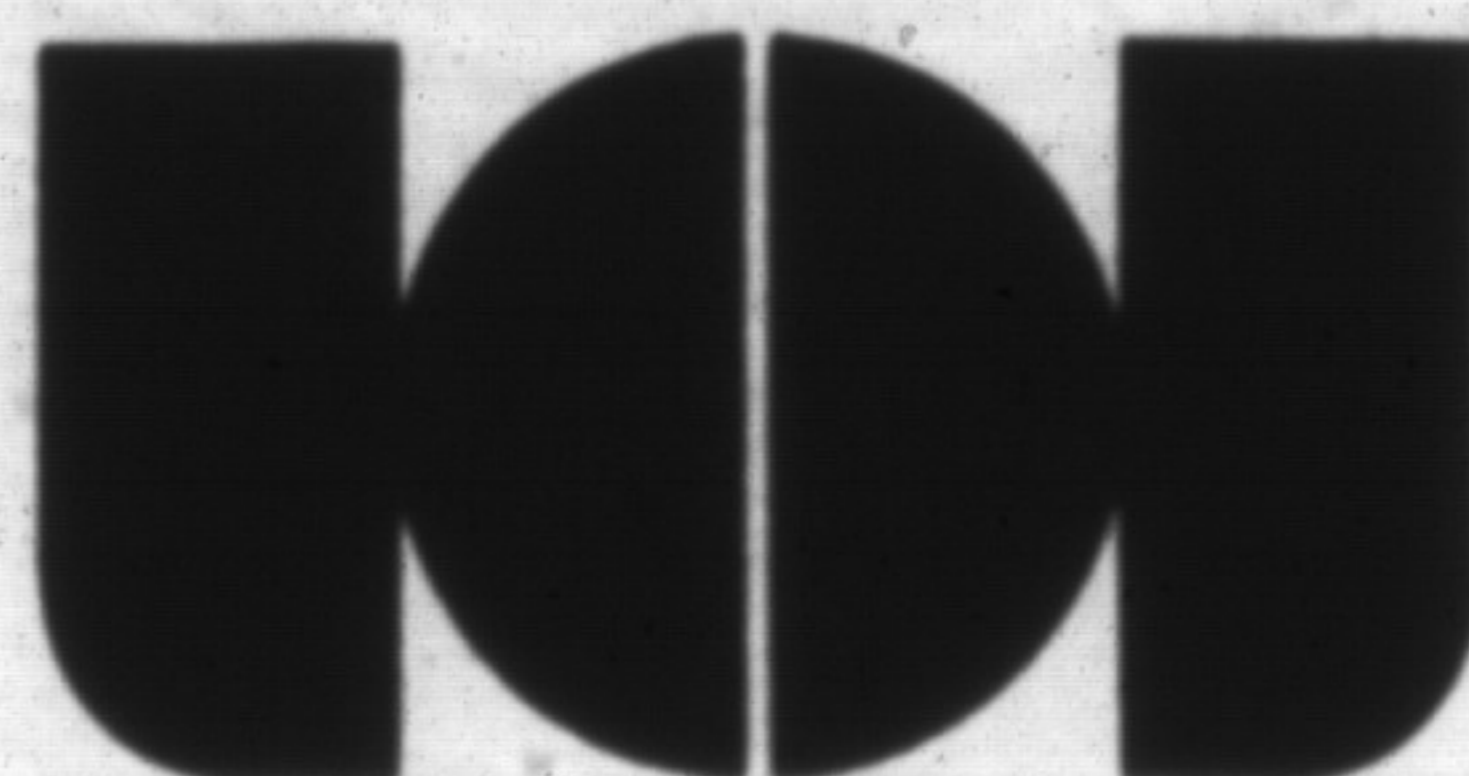

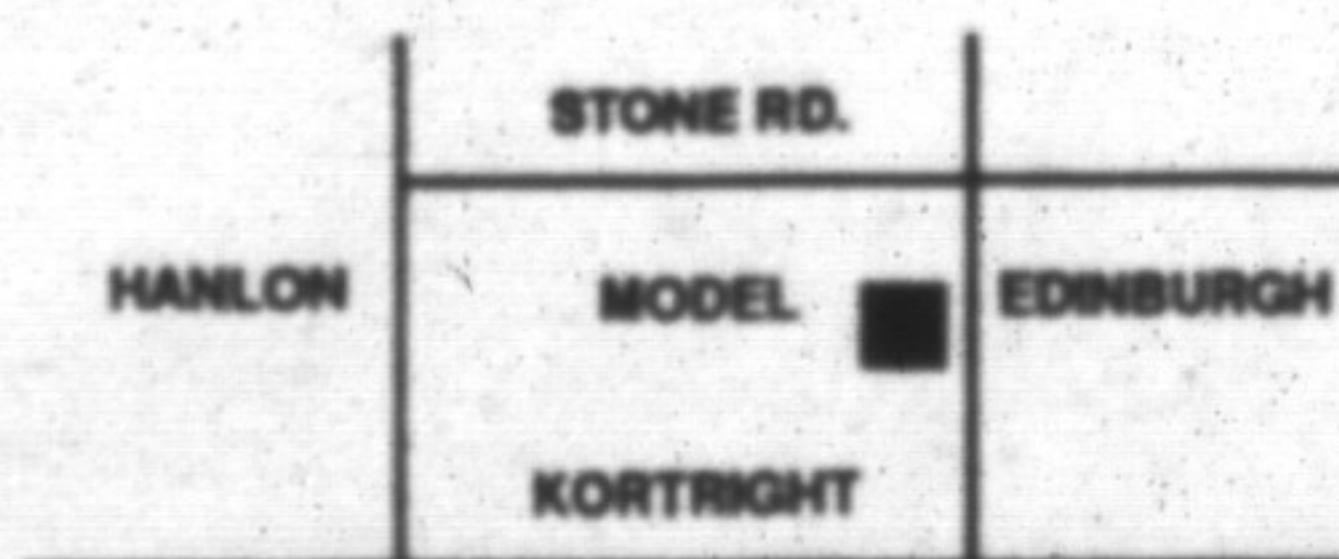
