**Halton councillors turn up their noses to tire burning plan**

The Ministry of Environment has offered a lukewarm response to a Halton Region request for a cement company to study burning used tires instead of costlier traditional fuels.

Not only does St. Mary's Cement of neighbouring Puslinch Township feel such a move would put a dent in the growing mounds of used tires, but figures it could save money on fuel.

Halton Region, on the other hand, wants to keep the tires out of its own dump, set to open in Milton within two years.

Public works commissioner Bob Moore explained that tires are a big nuisance in landfills. First, they're bulky, taking up valuable space. Second, they don't degenerate or compress, but instead keep working back to the surface like a sliver working its way out of the skin.

However, the type of recycling St. Mary's has in mind — incineration — has gradually run out of favor to the point where it's now viewed by the Province to be just as bad as landfilling.

In a letter to this Wednesday's regional council meeting, Ontario's environment minister Jim Bradley con-

firmed "Ontario is taking a very cautious approach to this procedure to ensure that the environment is protected."

"Any application for test burning of tires, such as at St. Mary's, will receive a close scrutiny of the environmental impacts."

He reminds councillors of his government's \$16-million, five-part recycling initiative which includes:

- Support for collection, handling and sorting of used tires;
- Funds for developing and implementing used tire processing and recycling technologies;
- Funds for research into tire-derived products and market development;
- A program to eliminate large tire stockpiles in Ontario;
- Funds to underwrite the use of recycled tire rubber in rubberized asphalt paving for roads, walks and parking lots.

A report prepared for St. Mary's says, pound for pound, tires are as good as conventional fuel, with less sulphur emission.
