

Blackout stops Heady's in Georgetown

On July 2 Heady's hosted Georgetown under the lights at Thompson Road field. The play moved back and forth for the first 20 minutes before Milton's Sue Rose went in alone from the left wing and put it away for the first marker.

Denise Leonard played forward for the first time this season and did a fine job, capturing Heady's second goal along the way. The half ended with the score 2-0 Milton.

The home side continued to play hard and Rose again hammered home a shot from her left wing position. Ten minutes later Karen Agate drove a hard shot in from the left side to push the score to 4-0. Heady's weren't finished as Michelle Van Grumsven notched the last goal to make it 5-0.

A week later the team travelled to Georgetown **But lose to Brampton**

to play CRSC United under the lights. CRSC came out strongly and scored in the first 15 minutes but Heady's buckled down and mounted a comeback. However, when the first half ended they had failed to score and the game remained 1-0 CRSC.

In the second half the lights at the Georgetown park failed to come on and the CRSC coach was unable to contact anyone so the game was cancelled. If necessary, it will be rescheduled.

The next Milton game, a week later on July 16, saw Caledon take control in the opening minutes and prove to be solid competition for the Milton squad. Both sides fought hard for every ball and neither had many breaks or shots on net.

Milton was awarded a corner kick and it was Abbott who once again crossed the ball beautifully. It hit a defender and trickled over the line. Ten

minutes later Caledon got a corner kick into the six-yard box. A Milton defender got up to clear it but it went off her and into the net. The half ended at 1-1.

The second half was tense and fast with each team pressing desperately to get the go-ahead goal. Twenty minutes into the half midfielder Marak intercepted a pass and had a breakaway on which she made no mistake to give Milton the 2-1 advantage.

The goal deflated the opposition and Kappos collected a pass from Agate and fired home the third Milton marker. Heady's got their fourth goal on a penalty kick from Kappos when Hickey was taken down in the 18-yard box.

Milton faces Bolton next and has five subsequent games to round out the regular season.

Under 13s shine in 2-0 win over Clarkson

In recent league action Milton's Re/max under 13 soccer reps split a pair of games, winning 2-0 over Clarkson in a hard fought and well played game but losing 3-2 at home against Brampton, the last place club.

Milton's season record now stands at two wins, three losses and two ties, which leaves the team six points back of league leading Erin Mills.

In a hotly contested, close division inconsistency has prevented the Realtors from keeping pace with the frontrunner. The team has played some excellent soccer this season, particularly against the teams at the bottom of the division.

The 3-2 loss against Brampton and an earlier 3-1 defeat by Caledon were

both crucial games in Milton's attempt to finish first overall.

Considering the strength of their other performances Milton should have handled both clubs easily. If not for these two games Milton would be only a pair of points behind the first place squad.

In Clarkson the teams battled through 65 minutes of scoreless play when suddenly, two goals within a minute by winger Shawn Kesik and midfielder Keith Mallette put the

game into Milton's pocket.

Kesik opened the scoring against last season's divisional champs converting a fine passing play from Cory Scott with a low shot to the corner.

Seconds later Mallette alertly jumped on a misplayed ball by the Clarkson keeper and rolled another low shot into the back of the net.

Although not tested severely, Milton keeper Boyd Laanstra made the key save when needed and got great support from fullbacks Kevin Davis, Scott McLaughlin, Sunny Dhillon and Brett Lewis to earn the shutout. Laanstra continues to play well. He picked up his seventh shutout in 23 league and tournament games.

Against Brampton, Milton held a

wide edge in territorial play and kept the ball deep in the offensive zone for the first 10 minutes.

Brampton made good on their first attack and took a 1-0 lead. Fabio Pento crashed a goal to tie it up for Milton off an indirect free kick set up by Chris Griffin. Before the half ended Dhillon finished off Scott's play to put his Milton squad ahead.

Milton could not hang on to the 2-1 lead, however. Brampton executed two perfect corner kicks in the second half, each counting for a marker, and Milton lost 3-2.

Under 16s pick up win

Milton's Canadian Tire under 16 team hosted Dixie at Thompson field last week and came away with a well deserved win. The 3-0 victory was despite Dixie's very physical and chippy style of play, according to Milton sources.

At no time during the contest did Milton ever look in trouble. Defensively Todd Dowell, Jason Penman, Tim Shier and Michael Gliddon completely closed the Dixie forwards and as a result most of the play was in the visitors' half.

The territorial advantage did not show on the scoreboard until a Ryan McLean penalty shot found the back of the net. Milton settled down once the goal finally came.

Dan Smulders scored a nice goal mid way through the second half and McLean again scored from a penalty shot to make it 3-0.

Sean Faulknor, Bill Gillies, Sean Tesser and Kian O'Higgins played well in defending goalie Scott MacDonald who claimed his first shutout.

Friendship tourney the biggest ever

The Milton Youth Soccer Club combined with the Milton Optimist Club to host the largest of the sixth annual Friendship Tournaments last Saturday.

Tournament chairman Ozzie Pento organized the competition in four age divisions involving 16 teams travelling from as far away as Belleville. Each team in the under 10, under 11, under 12 and under 14 divisions was guaranteed three games in the round robin format.

In the under 14 division Milton's Madison Chemical faced teams from Belleville, Newmarket and Woolwich. Milton's game plan, to score early and often, was tailored for round robin play. While dispatching Woolwich 4-0, tying Belleville 1-1 and destroying Newmarket 6-0 Milton racked up a formidable 11 goals while only allowing one.

The goal spread earned the championship and Belleville, with an identical 2-0-1 record, claimed second place. They managed a four goals to one spread.

In the under 12 division Milton Optimists opened with a 2-1 win over Guelph. The second game was heading toward a 3-3 tie, when, with only minutes remaining,

Streetsville struck for two quick goals to sneak out a win.

In the third game the goalposts were a major factor. Scarborough hit four before finally scoring. The locals pinged a pair of posts but could not score and lost 1-0. Scarborough hung on to win the division and Streetsville finished second with Milton third.

In the under 11 division Milton's Supreme Auto Collision started on the right note with a 2-0 victory over Oakville but were held to a scoreless draw with Cambridge and dropped a 3-0 decision to Waterloo despite controlling 90 per cent of the play in both games.

Waterloo earned the divisional championship with two wins and a tie while Cambridge finished second. Supreme Auto managed a third.

The Wynn's Canada under 10 team had similar scoring problems and recorded a scoreless draw with Waterloo and a 1-1 tie with Woolwich before dropping a 1-0 contest to Newmarket. Newmarket came out on top of the division with an unbeaten record in their three games. Waterloo earned second place honours and Milton captured third.
