# Peewee Selects win Port Credit conso championship

The Milton Selects peewee baseball team managed a 5-1 record in winning the consolation championship in the Port Credit tournament. The team, which had a season record of 9-4, used practice to put together a solid squad. According to coach Scott Anders they practise two

or three times per week. In the first game Milton clobbered Brantford 10-0. Nolan Milec started for Milton, picking up the win. He struck out six of the 11 batters he faced. Jamie Walker mopped up, blanking Brantford in the final frame.

Offensively, Chris Browning started things off in the second with a single. Cory Bourgon took a walk and Devin Richardson punched a two run double. Nigel Harding earned an RBI on his single to score Richardson and Milton led 3-0. In the third inning Milec poked a

single and was followed by Jay Black and Darryl Milec with singles. With two men on Browning crushed a three run homer to give Milton a 7-0 lead. In the fourth frame Milton got the required three runs and Brantford succumbed to the mercy rule, 10-0.

Harding, Neil Bagley, and Mike Amantea each cracked singles and scored on heads up baserunning to end the first contest. In game two starting pitcher Jamie Walker faced 11 batters and recorded three strikeouts in the 9-3 win over Oakville. Darryl Milec faced six batters and struck out a pair in the final frames.

Bourgon stroked a single and scored on Jay Black's single to give Milton a 1-0 lead at the end of the first inning. In the third, Bourgon started it again with a single and Nolan Milec and Black followed with safeties to push a run across. Browning blasted a two run single to put Milton up 4-0.

In the fifth inning Amantea got to first on an error and Bourgon drove him in on his double. Nolan Milec earned another RBI, scoring Bourgon, and Black doubled to score Milec. Brother Darryl took a walk and Richardson popped a two run single to give Milton a 9-0 lead.

In the bottom of the fifth frame Oakville tried to rally and managed three runs before they were shut down by the Milton defence.

Milton then took on West Mountain in the third game of the tournament and claimed an 11-1 win. Darryl Milec faced 11 batters and struck out two, while Bourgon faced three and didn't allow a hit.

In the first inning West Mountain jumped to a 1-0 lead but Milton called in the lumber company and managed two runs to claim a 2-1 lead after one. Bourgon led off with a single, Nolan Milec bashed an RBI double and Black followed with a sacrifice for the second run.

In the third inning Black stood on second after a leadoff double. A single by Darryl Milec and a walk to the one man wrecking crew Browning filled the bases for Brian Nykoruk, who laid down a perfect squeeze bunt for a run. Richardson cleared the bases with a three run double, followed by Amantea's single to score Richardson.

Walker singled and Bourgon banded a two run single to give Milton the 11-1 lead. Fine defensive plays shut down the West Mountain team in the bottom of the third inning and Milton was awarded the mercy win.

The fourth game of the tournament saw Milton beat Bloor 7-3 — despite having lost twice this year to Bloor in league action.

Nolan Milec faced 13 hitters and notched four strikeouts. Walker picked up the save in facing 12 batters and allowing only two runs.

In the first inning Bourgon punched a leadoff triple before Black, Milec and Browning each reached base on errors. Neil Bagley scored Browning on his single to give Milton a 4-1 lead after one. Darryl Milec smashed a homerun to make it 5-1 for Milton.

In the sixth inning Milton struck again to make it 7-1. Bloor tried to come back in the sixth, but after two runs Milton closed the book on the rally and knocked them out of the tournament.

Milton's next game was the semi-final match, which they lost to Kitchener 12-8. Nolan Milec started again for Milton and faced 15 batters in allowing three runs. Milton's other pitcher gave up nine runs on 11 hits and a pair of errors.

In the first inning Milton got behind the eight ball when Kitchener took a 3-1 lead. In the third frame Nolan Milec and Black singled and Darryl Milec brought home a run while Browning brought home two others both with a single. Richardson

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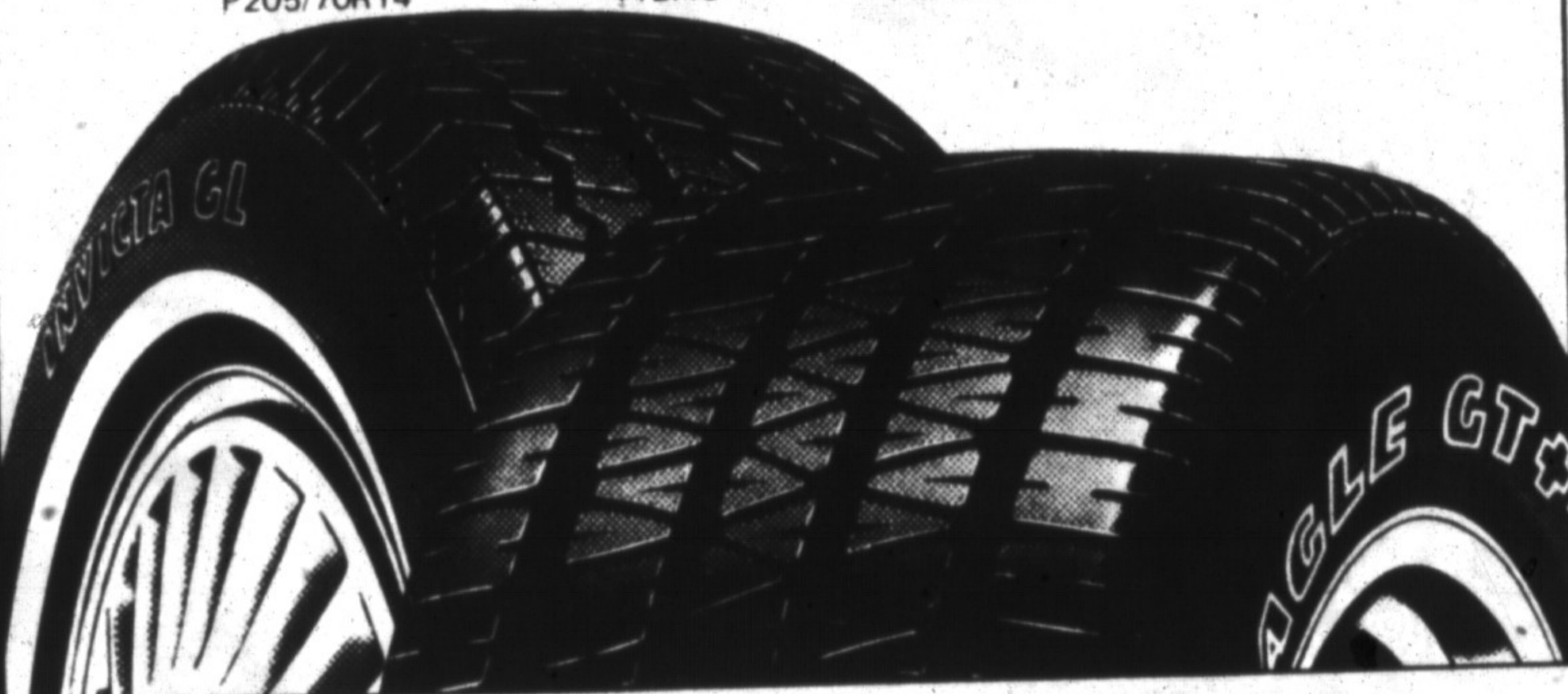
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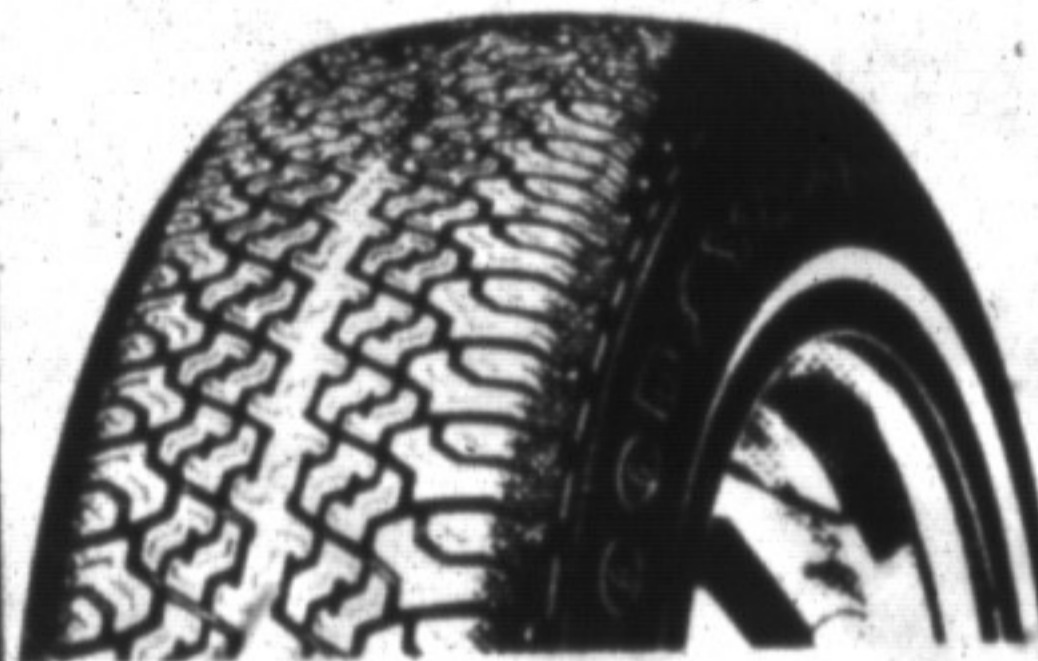
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
