'What did you do in the war, daddy?'**

The Milton Public Library has several books from the Singer Sewing Reference Library, one of which is entitled *Sewing with an Overlock*. The overlock machine, also called a serger, appeared on the home market only 10 years ago.

**Golden touch**

In *The Midas Touch*, Anthony Sampson will tell you how money makes the world go around.

He concentrates on the 1980s, assessing changes in attitudes to money and the shifts of wealth — in the context of the Crash of '87, American's debts, Japan's surplus and the post-Reagan mood in Washington.

He points out the different aspects of the power of money by highlighting examples from the United States, Japan, Britain, China, Latin America and Africa.
