

Sweethearts Ontario T-Ball champs

Kitchener Sizzlers were finally dethroned as Ontario champs recently as Milton National Life Sweethearts won the Ontario Senior Girls T-Ball championship for the first time.

Thunderstorms eliminated the scheduled Sunday playoff games of the weekend tournament, which was then decided by the round robin results. The Sweethearts and the Sizzlers had finished with identical 3-1 records but the tournament went to Milton on the basis of their 27-24 win over Kitchener on Saturday. During the season the teams clashed five times, with Milton taking all but the initial meeting in early June.

In their match with the Spitfires the lead chanaged three times and when the final bell rang the Sweethearts found themselves on the short side of a 26-19 score. This loss was only the third for the Sweethearts during the entire 1990 campaign, which they completed at 13-3.

In their other two matches during the tournament Milton dominated, claiming a 28-16 win over Clarkson and a 31-18 win over Erin Mills. In all games except the Eirn Mills game, the Sweethearts demonstrated the depth of their defence by keeping to their practice of switching the infield for the outfield, inning by inning.

Sharing first base were Julie Leal and Tracy Tonna. Tonna, as last batter, hit one homer while driving in more than 20 runs. Leal hit two homers, one triple, two doubles and 11 singles.

Alternating at second base were Michelle Gregory and Tara Fiorita. Gregory hit one triple, three doubles and 10 singles while Fiorita added 10 singles

At third were Kristen Haringa and Virginia Young. Haringa hit two triples, three doubles and nine singles while Young hit a homer, a triple, two doubles and 10 singles.

Sharing the shortstop spot were Laura Spagnuolo and Lindsay

Crisold. Spagnuolo mashed three homers and 12 singles while Grisold crashed a homer, three triples, four doubles and seven singles.

Alternating in the up-the-middle positions of catcher, pitcher and centerfield were Jennifer Hayward, Raena Worrell and Kim Parker. Hayward hit a homer and chipped in with eight singles, Worrell had 17 singles and Parker added a further half dozen.

Dick Hoyt and his son Rick, a victim of cerebral palsy proved their triathlon prowess, finishing the Olympic distance Reebok World Triathlon in only three hours and 13 minutes.

Hoyt, 50, swam the 1.5 kilometres of Lake Kelso while towing Rick in a dingy, cycled the 40-kilometre course with Rick's chair mounted on the bike's handlebars and ran the final "10 kilometres while pushing Rick in a wheelchair.

The top 10 male and female finishers of the event split a \$50,000 prize purse.

First-place finishers took home the Royal LePage Cup and \$7,000 each. Second and third place finishers received \$5,200 and \$4,000 respectively. The \$50,000 Reebok World Triathlon prize purse makes it one of the world's top paying triathlon events.

The Reebok triathlon was the eighth race in the nine-race Royal Le-Page triathlon series which con cludes with the championship race in Huntsville on Sept. 8.


