

Peewee selects finish second at Oakville tourney

The Milton Selects peewee baseball team took second place at a tournament in Oakville recently.

The locals opened the tournament with a 6-4 win over Heart Lake. Milton starter Nolan Milec faced 11 batters. He recorded two strikeouts and did not give up a run.

In the first inning Nolan Milec started off with a single, Jay Black got to first on an error and Darryl Milec sacrificed to score his brother. Great defence shut down Heart Lake in the first inning.

In the fourth inning Jay Black got a single and Darryl Milec scored him on a one-run double. Brampton scored one in the bottom of the fourth but Milton got another run from Devin Richardson's RBI double, which scored Nigel Harding in the bottom of the fifth. Heart Lake got another two runs to battle back and shave Milton's lead to 4-3 Milton.

In the top of the sixth Cory Bourgon took a walk and stole second. Jay Black also took a walk so manager Scott Anders put on the

double steal which set up Darryl Milec's two run single to push Milton's lead to three runs.

In the second game of the tournament Milton cruised to an easy 8-2 win over Niagara Falls. Jamie Walker started on the hill for Milton and he faced 12 hitters, counting four strikeouts and giving up only a single run.

In the first inning Nolan Milec punched a double, Darryl Milec hit an RBI single and Chris Browning followed with another single for a 2-0 Milton lead. In the second Harding, Walker and Jamie Foster all got walks and with the bases loaded Neil

Bagley chipped a one run single. Harding and Walker then took advantage of a shaken Niagara Falls pitcher to steal home and push the score to 5-1.

In the third inning Black earned a leadoff single, Darryl Milec walked and Mike Amantea sacrificed a run home. Chris Browning came to the plate and he went deep over the 12-foot centre field fence, 280 feet from home plate. The two run shot put the final nail in the cataract city's coffin.

In the third game Milton demolished Oakville B's 15-3. Milton put four pitchers into the game. Starter

Nolan Milec faced six hitters and gave up no runs. Walker faced six and gave up a pair of runs to Oakville, while Bagley faced four hitters and gave up a run before Bourgon came in and shut the door.

Offensively the whole team helped out. Bourgon and Nolan Milec chipped in with two singles as did Walker. Black had a two run double.

By virtue of their 3-0 record Milton advanced to the finals against Oakville's A's. Milton got on the board in the first inning with Jay Black's single followed by Darryl Milec's one run triple. Oakville's defence stiffened and Milton matched them

until the bottom of the fifth.

Milton got into trouble when they made two errors which led to a pair of runs before a sacrifice pushed the score to 3-1 Oakville. Milton didn't quit but they were unable to push another run across the dish and the game ended 3-1.

"The boys played great baseball in the last two weekends," said Anders. "It was too bad two errors cost them a game, but it was a great game to watch, a hard one to play, and pressure packed." Anders said Milton had played Oakville A's twice before and come away with easy wins both times.
