It's a bumper crop this season

There will be no excuse for not eating your vegetables this year. Joe Vyenaka, horticulture crop specialist at the Ministry of Agriculture's Ancaster office, said Mother Nature has produced "a tremendous year for both quality and yield... it's the best quality we've ever had — especially the cauliflower and cabbage. The potatoes are just phenomenal. The same for carrots and onions in the Holland Marsh."

"We've not lost any crop to date due to weather, insects or disease." Quite the opposite, he added. "There hasn't been a crop that's not been spectacular — except for asparagus in the spring."

Ironically, he said the banner year has resulted in poor prices being paid to farmers for their produce.

Phyllis McMaster, agriculture officer out of the Milton office, relates the same scenario for cereal crops.

Average yields are up while prices are down from last year, she confirmed. As far as fruit, Mr. Vyenaka said the strawberry crop went "reasonably well," while the raspberries — which suffered some damage through the winter — were off by about one-third from the expected yield.

A similar prognosis is forecast for the fall apple crop. "Apples in this area are about two-thirds of what the trees can bear. But the apples sizes are exceptionally good, he noted."
