

Iroquois join celebration

The rich heritage of Canada's native peoples will be highlighted as Indian Summer returns to Crawford Lake Conservation Area this Sunday (September 9) from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

A special attraction in the Indian Village will be Iroquoian drummers, singers and dancers who will be demonstrating a variety of native songs and dances in traditional dress.

Cayuga Elder Jacob Thomas will be sharing his vast knowledge of the 'People of the Longhouse' during scheduled appearances at the conservation centre.

Also on tap: a Native arts and craft sale including leather goods, moccasins, jewellery, beadwork and prints; demonstrations in corn husk doll and basket making; leisurely wagon rides on the beautiful Woodland Trail to the spectacular Nasagaweya Canyon; native games and crafts for kids; and tours of the prehistoric Iroquoian Village.

All-terrain wheelchairs for the disabled and elderly will be available during the day on a first come, first serve basis.

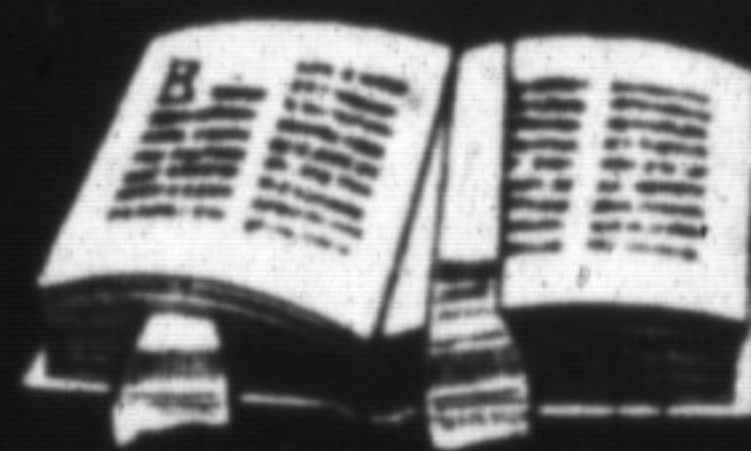
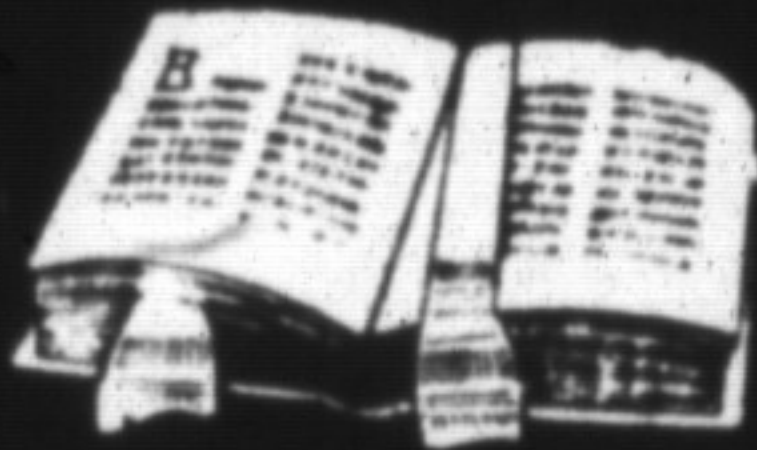
Poker on the run

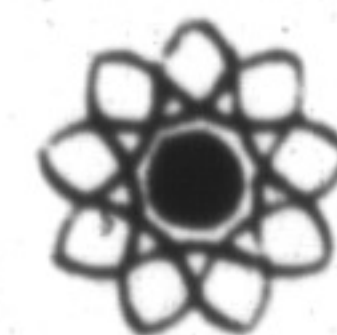

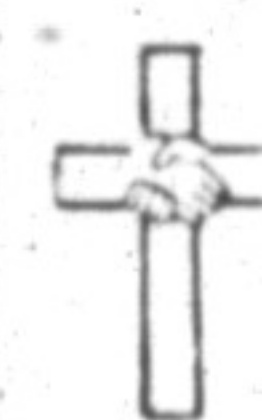

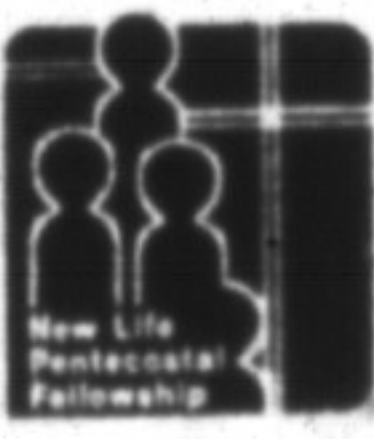
