

## Fox Run raises \$6,000

The 10th annual Terry Fox Run set a record for the amount of funds raised in Ontario, but unfortunately, Milton didn't have the same success. The Milton run at E.C. Dury High School Sunday raised close to \$6,000, down from \$7,933 last year, said Bob Pecora, who organized the event. About 150 people participated in the run. They walked, ran or cycled the 10-km course, four laps around the perimeter of the Ontario Street campus.

Money was raised through donations and pledges solicited by participants. Once again, Milton resident Sam Perry brought in the most money. He earned \$1,700 on his own. Meanwhile, Ontario raised \$3.2 million, said Mr. Pecora. That's up considerably from \$2.5 million last year. The money will be put toward Terry Fox's dream of finding a cure for cancer.

## Brutal assault unsolved

A brutal assault in Oakville one year ago is still being probed by police.

On the evening of Sept. 18, 1989, Barry Boyce, an Oakville businessman, was in Hamilton at the Windsor Hotel. He left the building, and drove his white Ford van to Tim Hortons' Donuts at John and Jackson Streets, where he picked up two coffees and was joined by a male.

A short time later, the van was seen on Jackson Street with Mr. Boyce driving an unknown male passenger.

At 8:30 a.m. the next morning, Mr. Boyce was found unconscious at his Dickie Dee Ice Cream office on Speers Road in Oakville. He had been brutally beaten and was near death from severe head injuries.

His van, with the name Snowbird on the sides, was stolen and later recovered near Hanrahan's Tavern in Hamilton.

Police seek information from anyone who may have seen Mr. Boyce or his white 1987 Ford van on the night of the assault or the next day.

### PUBLIC COMMENT NOW BEING ACCEPTED

September 19, 1990

As a requirement under Ontario's Environmental Assessment Act, the Town of Milton hereby notifies all interested individuals and parties that subject to the comments received as a result of this Notice and the receipt of other approvals as necessary, the Town of Milton intends to proceed with the planning, design and construction of the above-mentioned project.

Due to the condition of Ontario Street, level of traffic volumes and the accident rate, in 1985/86 the Town of Milton carried out a preliminary design study for the section between Derry Road and Steeles Avenue. Subsequently, the sections from Main Street to Wakefield Road and Mountainview Drive to George Street were reconstructed to five lanes while the section from Derry Road to Laurier Avenue is scheduled for reconstruction this fall.

On May 16, 1990 a public information centre was held to review the four and five lane schemes to complete the widening of Ontario Street between Derry Road and Steeles Avenue. Based on comments of members of the public and external agencies and the comparative analysis of the four versus five lane schemes, the Town has concluded that the widening to five lanes is preferred. Therefore the Town has identified this as a Schedule "B" Project under the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Road Projects.

Interested individuals and parties have 30 calendar days from the date of this notice to comment on the proposal. Comments must be made in writing and must be received by the Town of Milton by 4:30 p.m. on Monday, October 22, 1990.

Bump-up requests must be received by the above date and submitted to the address below. If there are no concerns expressed by the above date, the Town of Milton will proceed with the design and construction of Ontario Street.
