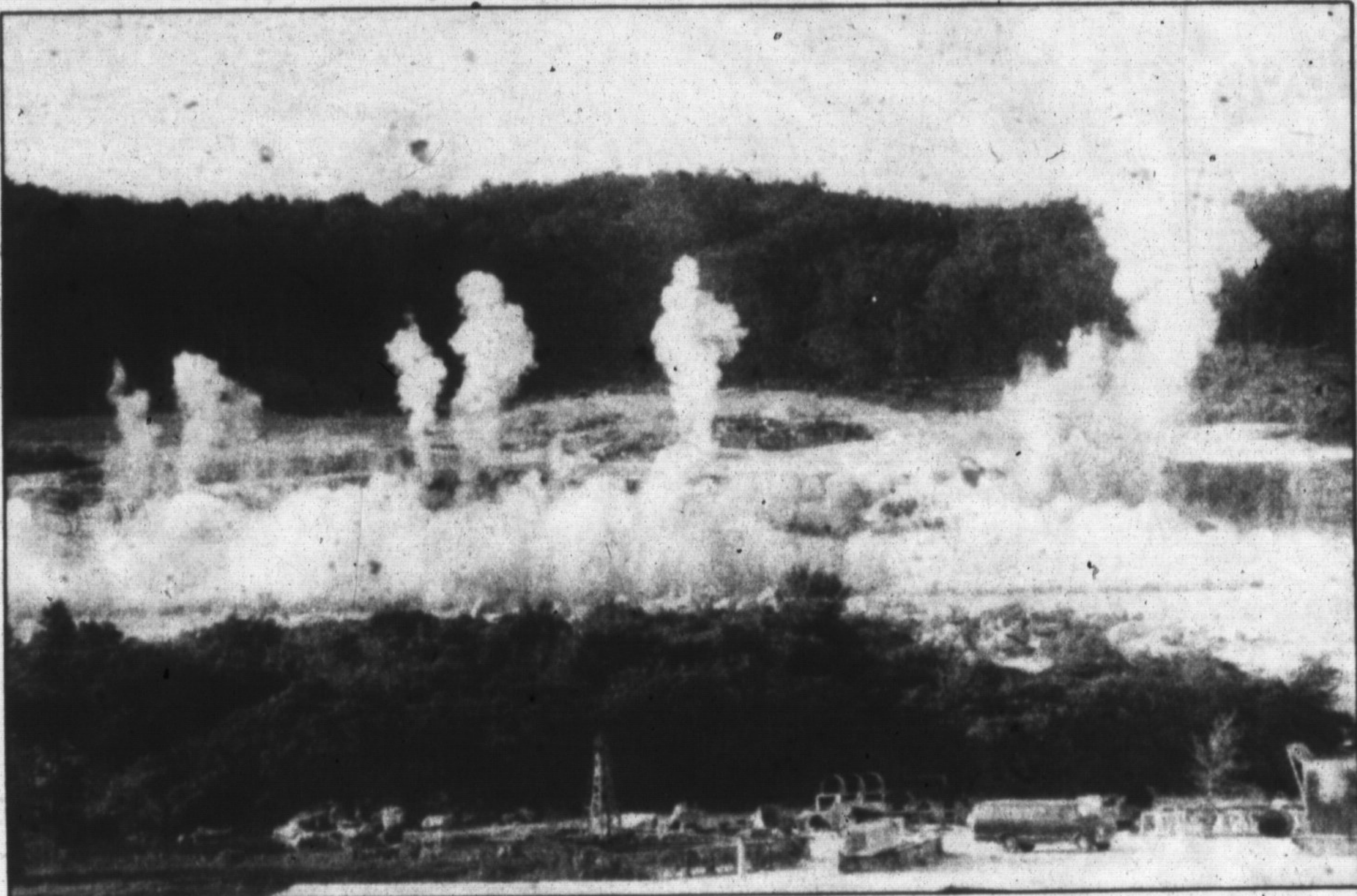

## B-L-A-S-T O-F-F!!!

A section of the escarpment went up in smoke last Wednesday afternoon when Dufferin Aggregates held a blasting demonstration at its Milton quarry.

The event was part of an open house held for the public to learn more about the quarry and its new blasting pattern.

The pattern resulted from a computer program designed to analyze blasting efficiency as it relates to reducing noise and vibration.

The open house attracted area residents who were given a bus tour of the site. Representatives of hydrology consultants Jagger Himms Ltd. and blasting consultants Oza Inspections Ltd. were on hand to answer any questions.

The quarry is the largest aggregate operation in Ontario. The primary plant is capable of producing more than 2,000 tons per hour, and on several days has shipped out more than 3,000 tons per hour.
