A prominent woman in Canadian amateur sport told Milton District High School students to be the best they can be Wednesday night. "Never give up," Carol Anne Letheren told the students. "You ab-

solutely have to keep pushing." Ms Letheren, who has been an athlete, coach and official, was the guest speaker at the school's Student Excellence Night. About 90 of last year's Grade 9-12 students received awards for achieving

averages of at least 80 per cent. The Toronto resident discussed her experiences as chef de mission for the Canadian team at the 1988 Olympics in Seoul, South Korea.

Her involvement as organizer of the team was an honour and an experience she will never forget, she said. And while marching behind the Canadian flag at the games, she learned the true meaning of national identity.

"We also learned what the true meaning of achieving excellence is,"

When Ben Johnson was stripped of his gold medal, the team faced "hardship, dilemma and pain. But we held our heads up high, wore our uniforms and continued on," she said.


The 48-year-old has a long list of credentials. She has coached archery and gymnastics at the national and international levels, and has officiated in gymnastics at Olympic Games.

Ms Letheren a "positive role for young people."








