Choristers release recording marking end of an era

Thanks to a just-released professional recording, fans won't have to wait for December's season opener to hear the soaring harmonies of the Milton Choristers.

Church in June, the recording—called Makin' Music—marks the end of an era for the group. It was the last work prior to the departure of Brainerd Blyden-Taylor, who served as musical director for the past eight years.

Under his direction, the group

progressed from basically a cast of talented showtune singers to one equally adept at handling Handel's Messiah or Haydn's Lord Nelson.

"He encouraged us to tackle more difficult pieces," explained Karen Davidson, a choir member who also handles the public relations chores.

Recorded in sanctuary

The recording was meant to not only serve as a "fitting momento" for Mr. Blyden-Taylor's tenure, but to also take advantage of his "considerable experience in recording."

Although it was recorded in a sanctuary, the group wisely decided to stress the lighter side, making it extremely accessible.

It covers some Canadian compositions and some old English classics but attention is focused on an area obviously much loved by the outgoing director, Negro spirituals, including Nobody Known the Trouble I've Seen and Give Me Jesus.

The original allotment of one day to record the session proved a little too ambitious.

that," said Ms Davidson, chuckling.

She said it was an exciting experience. "There's a lot of pressure in performing for a recording. You have to be very, very focused.

"There's a tremendous feeling of closeness and camaraderie with the other members that makes you want to do the best job possible."

With the exciting project behind them and the summer break at an end, the Choristers are again tuning up their voices at weekly practices, preparing for December's annual Christmas programs. "We're well into Silent Night and Joy to the World and a few other interesting selections," she said.

Guiding them is Dr. Patricia Phillips who, like her predecessor, sports an impressive resume, including a degree from Carnegie-Mellon University and a doctorate in Musical Arts from Yale University.

She's currently music director for the Metropolitan United Church in Toronto, director of the Metropolitan Festival Choir and an accompanist with the Guelph Chamber Choir.

Walks of life

With the Choristors, she finds herself at the helm of a diverse collection of about 50 local vocalists ranging in age from young adults to senior citizens.

They come from all walks of life —
from farmers and journalists to
lawyers and doctors. And their musical accomplishments range from
talented beginners to accomplished
musicians.

Ms Davidson, for one, confessed she hadn't sung seriously since high school before joining the Choristors. Tackling some of the more difficult classical selections, she said modestly, "was quite a stretch for me."

"Coming back as an adult in my thirties, I find it really provides a good counterbalance to my career."

Ms. Davidson is a journalist for a national agriculture magazine based in Milton.

Practices are held every Tuesday night from 7:30-10 p.m. and new members are always welcome to audition. The group is purticularly looking for bass and tenor vocalists.

In addition to the season's main performances, the Choristers are also active in the community, performing at Halton Centennial Manor, Milton District Hospital and Canada Day celebrations at Rotary Park.




