Immunize your pet at low-cost clinic

Halton residents can get their cats and dogs immunized against rables tomorrow(Saturday).

Sponsored by the Toronto Academy of Veterinary Medicine, clinics will be open from 1-3 p.m. at Prospect Park in Acton (at the boathouse), Cedarvale Park in Georgetown and Trafalgar Animal Hospital in Oakville (1063 Sixth Line).

The cost is \$6 per immunization.

Always present in wildlife in southern Ontario, rabies is a fatal disease that can spill over into domestic animal populations and to humans.

Foxes and skunks are the most common carriers, but it is also prevalent in raccoon and bat populations. Rabbits, chipmunks, squirrels, rats and mice are rarely infected.

Rabies is caused by a virus that is usually transmitted by the bite of an infected animal.

The virus from the infected animal's saliva enters damaged nerve pathways in the wound and

begins to migrate through the nervous system to the brain (taking anywhere from two to eight weeks), where it causes extensive damage.

Symptoms are not always of the 'mad dog' variety. Afflicted animals can appear frightened, docile, vicious or display a combination of all these postures. Unusual behaviour on the part of an animal should therefore be viewed with suspicion.

Once symptoms have appeared, rabies is invariably fatal. Fortunately, there has not been a human case of rabies in Ontario in 23 years.

This success has been achieved largely through vigilance.

Health departments across the province routinely investigate all reports of animals biting humans to determine if possible exposure to rabies has occurred.

Individuals thought to have been exposed to the disease are treated with anti-rabies vaccine. Since 1967, more than 40,000 people in Ontario have been successfully treated for exposure to rabies.
