

Novices even record with win over Richmond Hill

The Halton Hurricane minor novices rebounded in fine form last Wednesday to even their record at 2-2 with a convincing 7-3 win over Richmond Hill at West Vaughan Arena.

Playing their fourth game in five days, Hurricanes coach Frank Hardy of Milton was understandably concerned about his team's stamina going into the contest. Coach Hardy's concerns seemed well founded when, early in the game, centre Joshua Tataryn crashed shoulder first into the boards, requiring trainer Paul Jean's attention for several minutes on the ice.

Despite being short on manpower the Hurricanes scored early as pesky centreman Shane Remenda opened the scoring midway through the first period with a goal set up by Jarrett Konkle and Mike Knoepell.

Richmond Hill tied it at one three minutes later before Tataryn, on his first shift back in action, tipped in his own rebound with one second left on the clock. Jordan Jeans and Mike Austen earned assists on the play.

The home side fought back early in the second to notch the score at 2-2, a score which stood up for the rest of the second frame.

The third period however belonged to the Hurricanes. Joel Petkoff assisted on Tataryn's second and third goals with Mike Austen and Carter Trevisani each helping on one.

Jordan Jeans sandwiched his tally in between, on passes from Konkle and Remenda. Petkoff scored to make it 6-2 and Chris Wulfers closed out the scoring with two minutes left in the game with Konkle and Remenda assisting.

Goaltender Garrett Lauzon played a good game for Halton turning aside 9 of 12 shots including a couple of solid scoring chances. The Hurricanes directed 26 shots at the Richmond Hill goalie.

Assistant coach Brad Butterworth was pleased with the work of his four blueliners who held the opponents to only four shots a period. The Hurricanes do not resume action until Saturday when they travel to Markham before a trip to Barrie on October 26.

Minor Peewee AAA

The Thanksgiving weekend found the Hurricanes playing in their first triple A tournament. The Tim Horton Hamilton International Triple A Tournament hosted 48 teams at three arenas.

Michigan, Ohio, Illinois, New York and numerous Ontario centres. At the minor peewee level eight teams competed in two divisions which pitted Halton up against Hamilton, Mississauga and Detroit. Although they didn't advance to the playoff round the Hurricanes showed well.

Halton opened against the Hamilton Huskies on Saturday. The first period was scoreless due to solid defensive work by Tom Baynton, Colin Page, Paul Neff and Ryan Taylor. Jeff Langille also contributed to the defensive effort with several great stops late in the period.

At 7:43 of the second period Jamie Briggs scored the game's first goal on a rebound from a Justin Davis shot. Later in the period Steve Roy and Doug Janjevich came close on a goal crease scramble, Curtis Carr broke in alone only to be stopped with a super pad save and Darin Finlayson scored with 17 seconds left in the period only to have it disallowed due to a high stick.

In the third period Hamilton brought the play to the Hurricanes tying the game 1-1 at the 9:03 mark. Moments later Hartholt, Mashinter and Walker put pressure on the goaltender but couldn't find the mesh. With 3:43 remaining in the game Hamilton scored their second to take a 2-1 lead.

With a minute to go Halton pulled its goalie in favour of another skater and moments later the move paid off as Doug Janjevich won a faceoff to the left of the Hamilton net, pulling the puck back to Justin Davis who quickly put it in the bottom corner of the net.

Goaltender Jeff Langille was named player of the game for his steady effort against the hard shooting Hamilton squad.

The Hurricanes second match was early Sunday morning against Mississauga. The 8 a.m. start didn't agree with the 'Canes and only the solid goaltending of Jim Leworthy kept the game close.

With Mississauga up by one going into the second the Hurricanes turned it up with some heavy hitting. At 4:58 Janjevich tied the game on a power play. Late in the period Mississauga regained their lead on a deflection that just trickled over the line before Leworthy could get it.

He did make an excellent save on a breakaway in the third and at 6:37 Janjevich scored his second of the game assisted by Steve Roy and Ryan Taylor. Davis was voted player of the game for Halton in their second 2-2 tie in as many games.

On Sunday night the Hurricanes faced off against Detroit GDP in a must win game as Hamilton had defeated Mississauga only moments earlier. Halton controlled play through much of the first period with Langille making two sparkling saves and Baynton, Neff, Taylor and Page controlling their defensive zone.

At 4:17 of the second period Detroit scored the game's first goal

on a low shot just inside the post. Before the period ended Janjevich left one on the goal line that the Hurricanes weren't able to get to before the Detroit goalie smothered it.

Early in the third Hartholt, Walker, and Peter Mashinter fired a flurry of shots at the Detroit goal with Mashinter just missing the tying goal. Shortly after the close call Detroit exploded for three quick goals to blow the game open.

It was not until 3:26 of the third period that Justin Davis took a lead pass from Briggs, beat the last defencemen and deked the goalie for the only Halton goal. Walker was named the game's most valuable player in the 4-1 loss.

Major Midget AAA

The Canada Brick Halton Hurricanes maintained their 500 league record in a two game weekend split. The locals lost 4-3 on Friday night in Hamilton and rebounded to double Burlington 4-2 at Alcott Arena in Georgetown on Saturday.

A number of Hurricane regulars were sidelined for the Hamilton game in the aftermath of an overly physical outing in Barrie a week earlier. The Hurricanes line-up was supplemented by some able bodied minor midgets including Mike McPhail, Tom Baier, Shawnee Tooley and Jake Mashinter.

Hamilton wasted little time in establishing a solid lead as they pumped in three goals in the first eight minutes of play. The Hurricanes gradually regained their composure and at the mid-point of the game cut the deficit to two goals on a power play marker by Brad Amato with Mike Cox and Joe Piazza assisting.

Halton's recovery continued early in the third frame when McPhail added another power play goal on a set up by defencemen Amato and Tooley. With 6:06 remaining, Hamilton capitalized on a two on one breakaway to make it 4-2.

Goalie Peter Downs was pulled with just over a minute remaining to give Halton a two skater advantage. McPhail added his second of the night from Baier with 56 seconds on the clock, but for the 'Canes their domination of the play in the late

going was too little, too late.

The Halton squad were undaunted by the narrow defeat of the previous night when they took to the ice in Georgetown on Saturday as hosts to Burlington. The Hurricanes stunned the visitors from the opening face-off as Trevor Elinsky and Rob Crowe moved the puck quickly into the Burlington zone to set up linemate Todd Mülley for Halton's first goal with just 11 seconds elapsed.

Goalie Downs was called on to make several impressive saves late in the opening period to maintain the lead. The Hurricanes also showed some solid penalty killing with Crowe, Cox and Damien Dubien working effectively.

Halton struck again early in the middle frame when Amato cleared to Elinsky who in turn fed Sean Guistini on the left flank. Guistini drilled a low, 30 foot shot to the short side to put the Hurricanes 2-0 ahead.

Burlington answered four minutes later on a breakaway, but again, the home team responded fed when the tenacious Pat Henneberry forced a cough up in the visitor's zone. Cox relayed the puck from behind the net to Piazza who slapped home the feed from eight feet out.

Halton carried the lead into the third where the teams traded goals before time ran out with Halton in the lead 4-2. The midgets play their next game October 21.
