

Wood returns with reservations after the death of rally partner

Ross Wood is back rallying again. After a two month hiatus from rally competition following the tragic accidental highway death of his rally partner, driver Andy Browning, Ross Wood returned to competition in the National Rally circuit on the weekend at the Rallye Automobile Charlevoix, located in the hills of Quebec's Eastern Townships.

For this one rally Wood decided to take up an offer he had received from Bob Elliott, the second-placed Production Class driver in the Canadian Championship.

Elliott drives a VW Golf GTI. Wood still stands first in the co-driver's championship, despite having sat out two events.

Exciting start

The rally got off to an exciting start for the new team when they rolled the car within two minutes of the start, but spectators righted the vehicle within seconds and they limped into the service pit, where suspension damage was repaired.

"I'm wondering if I'm bad luck to drivers," Wood said. "Andy also rolled on the first rally I did with him."

However, by the halfway point, Wood and Elliott were leading their class by a few seconds. Then the transmission gave out and their rally was over.

Holds the lead

Ironically, the next two teams in the championship standings also experienced difficulties, so Wood still holds the lead with one race to go. It will be held on Nov. 24 in Peterborough.

A memorial fund set up to donate a sailboat to the Canadian National In-

stitute for the Blind summer camp in memory of Andy Browning is growing steadily. The presentation will be made at the Tall Pines Rally.

Wood's plans regarding future competition remain indefinite.

Several teams have offered him a ride next year, but no decision has been reached.

"I'm not sure I want to go back," said Wood. "It isn't the same without Andy."

At Kelso

Guzman, Scobie lead ECD seniors to GHAC cross-country title

E.C. Drury's senior girls cross country team captured first place in Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference (GHAC) action last week at Kelso Conservation Area.

The team consisting of Jennifer Guzman, Tiffany Scobie, Melanie Hewitson, Ann Guzman and Angela Hewitson scored 30 points, a full 20 points better than the second place squad.

The best four finishers from a school have their placings added together, with the lowest score taking the title.

Drury runners finished first, second, eighth, and 19th to claim the gold. Guzman and Scobie were one-two.

The same five athletes will represent E.C. Drury and Halton at the All-Ontario OFSAA (Ontario Federation of Schools Athletics Association) Championships in London at Fanshawe College Conservation Area on Saturday.

In the junior boys race Paul Sutherland turned in a strong effort, finishing seventh, one place out from competing at OFSAA. Mike Belford was 25th, Jeff Belford 34th and Brad Lister failed to finish.

In the senior boys race the Drury team of Dylan Reynolds, Dave Gillies, Jim Twist, Cliff Palmer and Kees Pouw finished fourth. Reynolds was the top Drury finisher, crossing ninth. Gillies was 12th, Twist 19th, Palmer 46th and Pouw 48th.

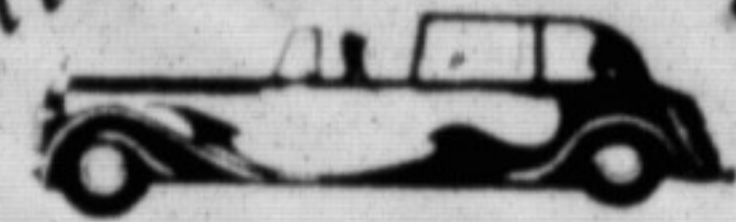
"We never thought we would have so much success," commented one of the coaches.
