 At 7:42 of the first Halton was caught on a line change and allowed Oakville a breakaway and the first blood of the game. Two minutes later, enjoying a one-man advantage, the Rangers scored their second to put the Hurricanes in a deep hole. Not easily intimidated, Halton

dominated the last five minutes of the period and with 54 seconds remaining the speedy Janjevich took

a Roy pass, skated in from the Ranger blue line, around the net, and stuffed it in a corner.
 Oakville took advantage of a power play early in the second, jumping on a rebound at 8:36 to retake a two-goal lead.
 At 13:10 Curtis Carr bumped out a Ranger defenceman behind the Oak-

ville net and passed to Roy in front, who wasted little time in scoring Halton's second goal of the period.
 Unfortunately, the Rangers caught the Hurricanes sleeping on a centre ice face off and at 13:19 Leworthy playing his third straight game, found himself facing three Ranger forwards who took advantage of the

situation to score their fourth goal.
 With only eight seconds remaining in an Oakville penalty, Janjevich passed back to Miller on the point, who let go a low slapshot which found the net for Halton's third goal, closing the spread to 4-3.
 The balance of the period was an exhibition of great goaltending at both ends of the ice. Roy was robbed by the Ranger goalie and Leworthy blanked an Oakville shooter who split the defence and broke in alone.
 The Hurricanes were finally able to solve the Oakville goalie puzzle at 11:24 of the third. Jamie Walker broke out with Finlayson and Davis. Using Walker as a decoy, Davis drove for the net, took a hard shot, and the rebound came to Finlayson. He tied the game at four.
 Milton received a minor for roughing at the mid-point of the frame. A little discord from the Halton bench prompted a bench minor and the Hurricanes were two men short. Oakville connected with only nine seconds left in the double penalty.

 Milton took a 7-1 loss in their tournament opener against Wexford. Mike Wheelihan scored the only goal, unassisted, for Milton. Later the same day Milton skated out to meet Etobicoke in a must-win situation.
 After spotting their opponents a goal Milton stormed back and rattled off nine straight for a 9-1 victory. Daniel Bonham led the team with three goals while Wheelihan popped a pair. D.J. Birnie, Craig Hudak, Paul Pento and Jason Ford each potted singles.
 Birnie, Hudak, Kaegen, Sherriff and Kevin Heffron each managed two assists and Bonham, Chris Bramwell and Gaelen Davies were credited with one each.

In weekend hockey action Milton hosted Erin on Saturday and Orangeville Sunday at Memorial Arena, picking up three points for their efforts with a win and a tie.
 Milton downed Orangeville 6-2 and tied Erin 3-3.
 In the Erin game Milton's Brad Jenkins opened the scoring at 1:02 of the first period, with assists from Matt Davenport and Shayne Ridley. Erin tied it up with only one second left in the period.
 In the second frame Erin scored a pair of goals to give them a 3-1 lead but with 60 seconds to go Jeremy Ridley scored to put Milton within one, assisted by Blanchet and Greg Newton.
 The third period was a display of end to end hockey with numerous opportunities for both teams. With 8:09 remaining in the game Newton scored to knot it at three, where it ended.
 Sunday Milton took on Orangeville and it was the home side's turn to avenge a defeat suffered in their first meeting. In the first period Ryan Harvey scored on a passing play from Pender and Jenkins.
 Only 25 seconds into the second frame Davenport scored, assisted by Jenkins and Pender, to give Milton a 2-0 lead. Orangeville scored to narrow the gap less than a minute later but Milton answered right back with a Ridley goal, assisted by Harvey.
