## Tudor Singers to serenade at Ebenezer Church Dec. 2

The Tudor Singers of Brantford will perform at Ebenezer United Church Sunday, Dec. 2.

Under the direction of Alvin D. Spaxman, the 21-voice choir will feature a choral recital of traditional Christmas music, early choral chamber music, and readings by Dr. Frank Morgan, a popular Kitchener cleric.

The event is the fourth musical presentation at the Guelph Line church in the last 18 months. Proceeds will help build a new addition to the facility.

Every concert has been filled to capacity, said organizer Dr. Stanley Saunders.

"We are delighted with the response to these concerts," he said. "It proved the interest and need for such events that combine the inspiration of our historic sanctuary, the tradition of our country welcome, and the celebration of our fine music."

The Tudor Singers have established a reputation for their polished presentation of a diverse and imaginative repertoire. Their performance will include pieces by contemporary English composer John Rutter as well as selections by Holst, Willan, Willcocks and Martin.

William Murphy, well-known Brantford musician and organist, will accompany the singers on the Ebenezer pipe organ.

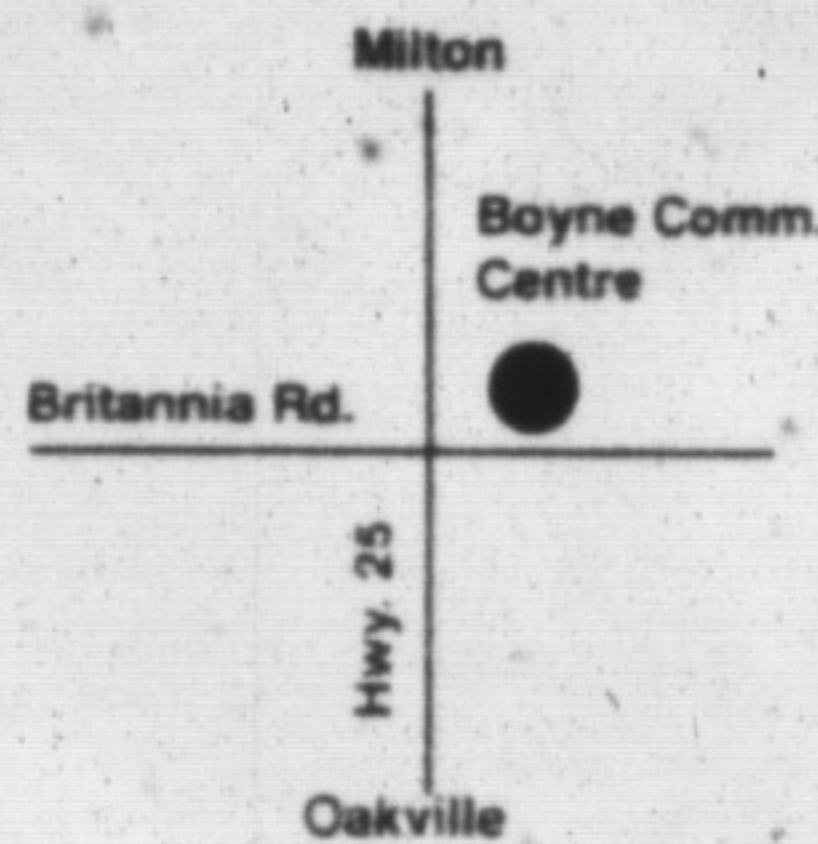
