We Adopted You, Benjamin Koo by Linda Walvoord Girard deals with a childless couple in America who greet their new Korean Baby at the airport. Benjamin Koo is the narrator.

Ben has leukemia in Althea's I Have Cancer. Once again, the child narrates. In a matter-of-fact fashion and in simple language, Ben describes his stays in the hospital and explains chemotherapy and radiation therapy.

I Meant to Clean My Room Today. Haven't we all heard that one? The little girl in Miriam Nerlove's story thinks up imaginative excuses for not tackling her messy room. She claims a pink monkey drops in to play. She also has to take a break from housework so she and a visiting grey cow can read some of her books.

Dr. Kevin Leman might have something to say to that child. In Making Children Mind Without Losing Yours, he introduces reality discipline, where actions speak louder than words. He offers entertaining, real-life situations that prove that his method is successful.


