Flamborough notched a pair to take a 2-1 lead by the time the first period ended.

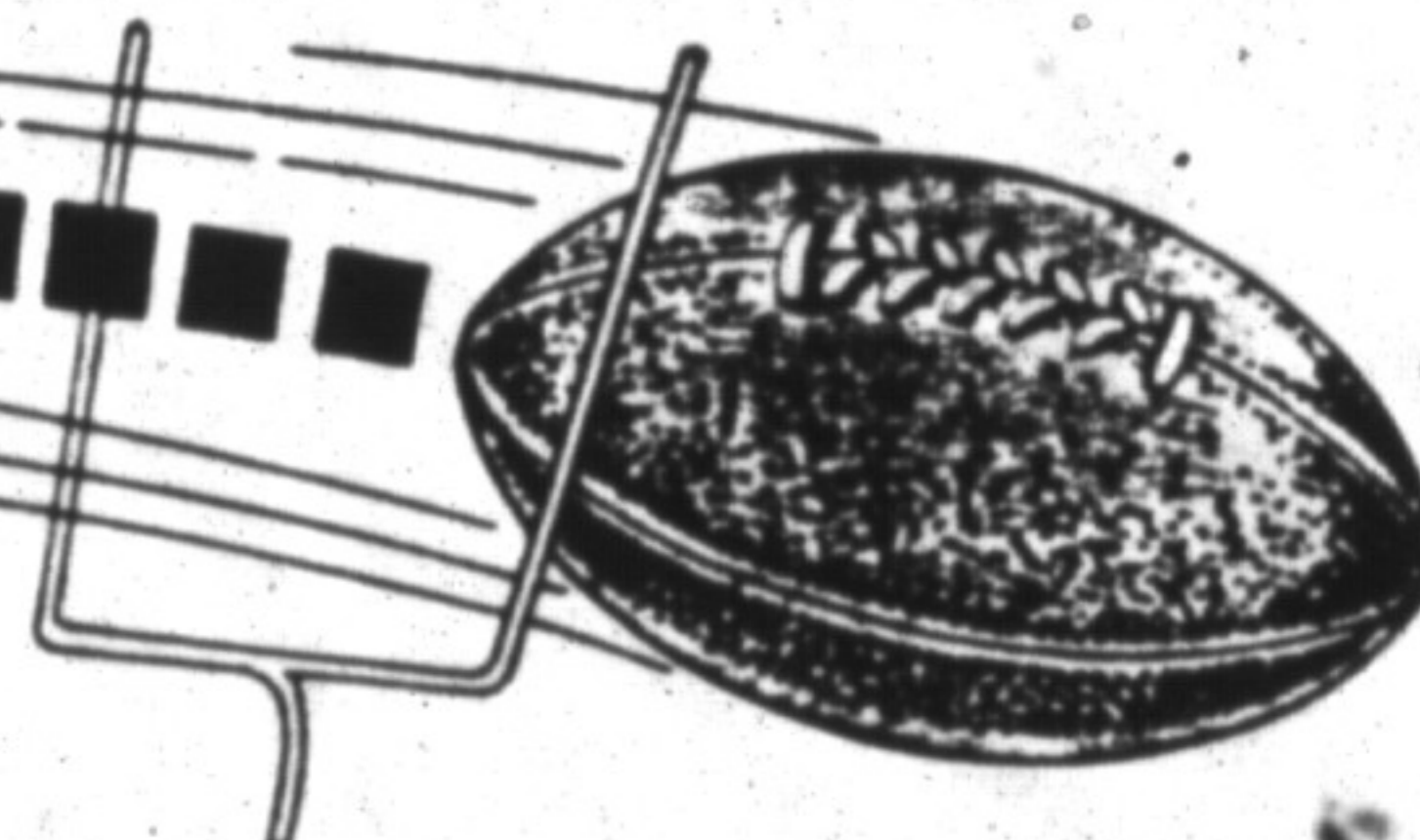
Milton managed to tie when Penson scored on a penalty shot in the second but Flamborough regained the lead at 3-2 before the period ended.
