Credit card crook sought A thief who stole a Burlington man's credit card and used it to steal a large sum of money from the victim's bank account is being sought by

Halton Regional Police. Overnight on October 24, the victim's car, which was parked on Butternut Crescent, was entered and his Canada Trust passbook and

Canada Trust Mastercard were taken. On October 25, a suspect turned up at three Canada Trust offices in Oakville and Burlington and, using the stolen credit card as identification, removed \$3,900 in cash — including \$2,700 in U.S. funds — from the victim's accounts. The stolen card has also been used to purchase gas and merchandise in the Oakville area.

The stolen card is a Canada Trust Mastercard and the suspect is described as male white, early to mid-30s, junt under six feet, about 200 pounds, muscular build, short brown han and wearing neat, casual clothing.
