

Parents frown on their young son's sex life

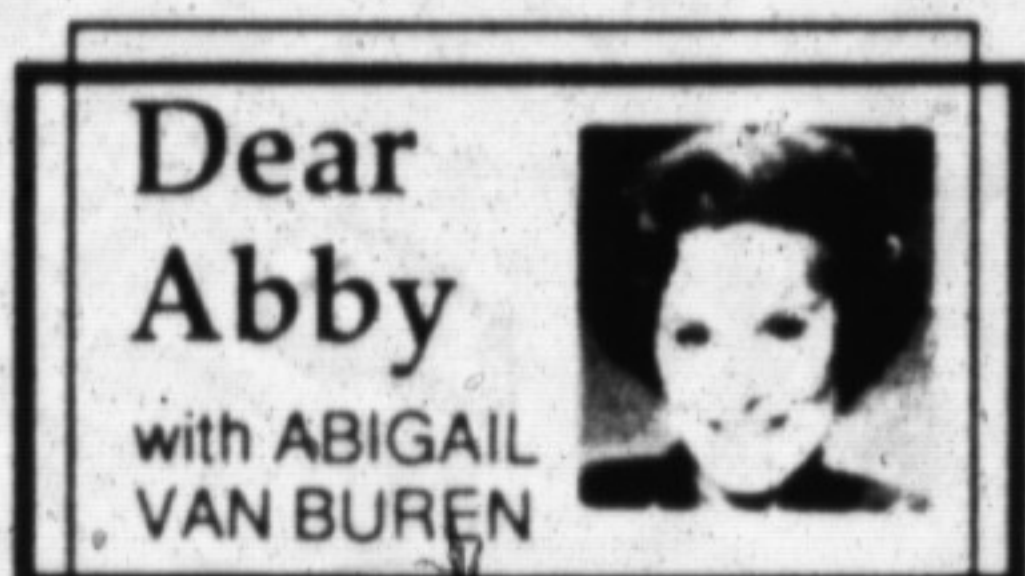

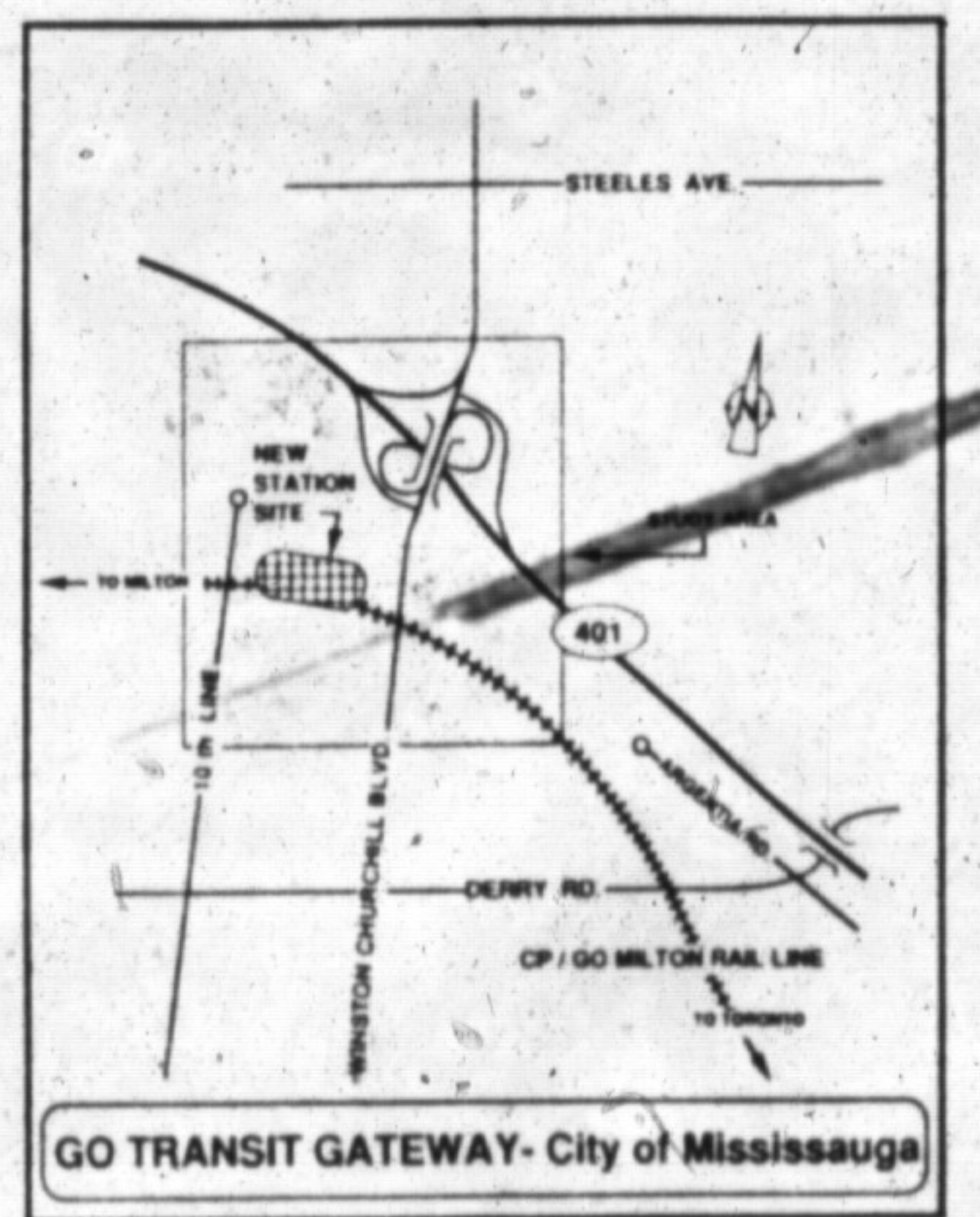

New GO Train Station Winston Churchill Boulevard South of Highway 401

Notice of Undertaking GO Transit is carrying out a design study for a new train station and transportation gateway as part of its rail service between Toronto and Milton.

The proposed site is west of Winston Churchill Boulevard, south of Highway 401, in the City of Mississauga. As a transportation gateway, the new station will be designed to facilitate the transfer of passengers between different modes of transit. Local bus and GO Bus bays, a kiss & ride passenger drop-off area, and parking for over 1,000 cars are planned.



It is anticipated that this will be a GO Transit Environmental Assessment Class B undertaking and as such will follow the process set out in GO's Environmental Assessment Class Document. An Environmental Study Report will be prepared, filed with the Ontario Ministry of the Environment before construction, and made available for public review. The public will be notified at the time of filing. If it is determined by GO Transit, ministries or agencies of the Crown, other interest groups, or individuals that the environment in the immediate area of the proposed undertaking is particularly sensitive, the undertaking may be redesignated to require a more extensive review and approval process.

The public is invited to comment on this undertaking before any final design decisions are made. Open houses will be held this winter where representatives of GO Transit and its consultant will be available to discuss the undertaking and any recommended alternatives. A notice will be published to inform the public of these open houses. Notice will again be published when the completed Environmental Study Report is filed with the Ministry of the Environment, but groups or persons will be individually notified of the filing, or the open houses, only if they specifically request so, preferably in writing.

Expansion of All-Day Service Milton GO Train Line

Notice of Undertaking GO Transit is carrying out a design study for the expansion of rail service on its Milton line between Toronto's Union Station and the Town of Milton.

Due to increasing commuter travel demand and the Government of Ontario's commitment to encourage public transit use, GO plans to provide more frequent all-day train service on this line (20-minute frequency in the peak hours and approximately hourly service during off-peak periods).

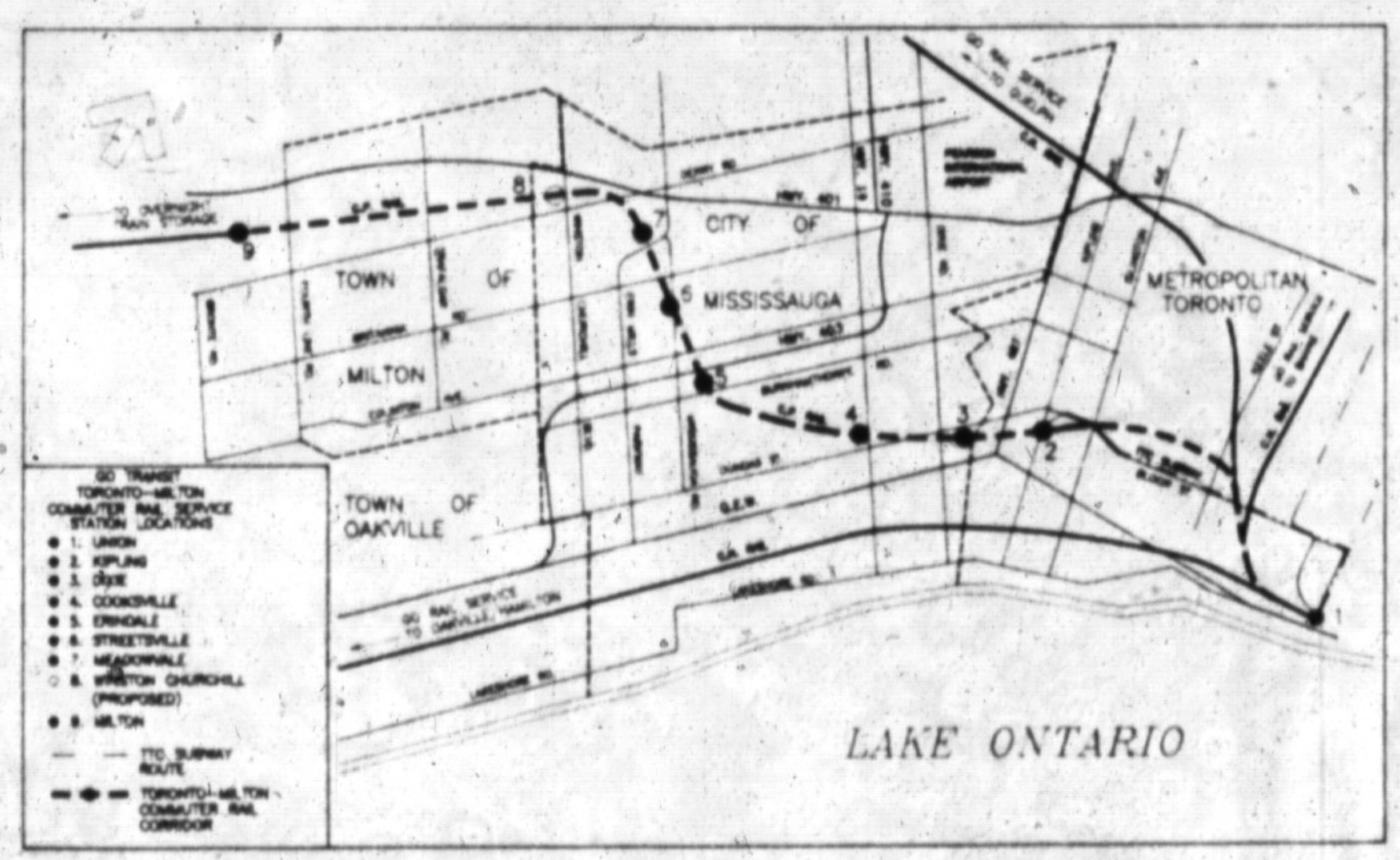
To implement the increase, an additional track is required along certain sections of the corridor; this would involve the expansion of bridges and culverts and may necessitate property acquisition. Existing GO stations and parking areas would also be modified to accommodate the additional service.

It is anticipated that this will be a GO Transit Environmental Assessment Class B undertaking and as such will follow the process set out in GO's Environmental Assessment Class Document. An Environmental Study Report will be prepared, filed with the Ontario Ministry of the Environment before construction, and made available for public review. The public will be notified at the time of filing. The Ministry of Transportation has completed a study which will result in the widening of Highway 25 from Highway 401 northerly 1.5 kilometres, in the Town of Milton, to four lanes with reconstruction of interchange ramps and provision of turning lanes.
