Sockets hit heavy competition

In the two weeks leading to Christmas the P.L. Robertson major novice AA Sockets ran into some heavy going against the two leading teams in their division.

The first contest was against Hamilton and turned into a defensive battle. Solid play by Chris Wulfer, John Stringer, Fraser Komow, Kris Beal and Tyler Rennie kept Hamilton to one goal at the end of the second period.

Unfortunately for Milton that was all it took to win.

In their next game they played Acton in an exhibition. Steve Chuchmach led the way for Milton with four goals. Craig Macdonald picked up two and Andrew Marshall and Mat Ventura one apiece combining for an 8-0 win for Milton.

Back in Milton facing Hamilton again the Sockets were once again stymied at the opposing net. Two goals in the first and two in the second gave Hamilton the 4-0 win.

Back to back games against Orangeville began in Milton. The first game saw Milton continually fighting back from behind. At the end of the first the score was 1-1. Milton's goal came off Chuchmach's stick.

At the end of the second Macdonald and Jason Holota scored one each to keep Milton alive 3-3. With less than two minutes remaining in the second frame it looked as though the game would end in a tie but two quick goals by Orangeville settled the score at 5-3.

In Orangeville, Milton carried the play in the opening minutes culminating in a real 'teamwork' goal by Holota assisted by Caleb Moffatt and Chuchmach. The Milton squad lost concentration after the goal and one minute later were down 3-1.

As in previous games Milton came back on goals by Moffatt and Chuchmach and the game was tied before the second minute was gone from the second frame. The goals concluded the scoring but not the excitement as Milton buzzed the Orangeville net but came up empty.

The final game before the holiday break was in Milton against Georgetown. A hat trick by Chuchmach

and a pair by Macdonald gave Milton the 5-4 win.

The Docs and Dents notched their second win in a row defeating Georgetown 4-2. The game featured a couple of bizarre events with the Milton goalie being ejected and later the referee removed a Milton coach from the bench.

A defensive lapse by Milton allowed Georgetown to take the lead in the first period. Milton's Kevin Heffron got the equalizer with help from linemates Adam Hearn and Mike Wheelihan. Georgetown scored again and held a 2-1 lead until late in the third period.

Docs and Dents rallied to finish the game in a rather dramatic manner. With 2:21 remaining the Medics struck for three goals in 75 seconds. Chris Bramwell netted a pair himself in 33 seconds. David MacFarlane picked up two assists by battling along the boards to feed the puck to the slot and Greg Moore got an assist on the relay to set up Bramwell. Mike Wheelihan completed the scoring with assists going to Kevin Heffron and Kaegen Sherriff.

Medics continued their scoring spree, potting three goals in the opening 90 seconds in their next game against Flamborough. Wheelihan scored twice in a record six seconds. In the opening minute Sherriff relayed a pass to Wheelihan to send him on his way for the first goal.

On the ensuing faceoff Wheelihan tipped the puck by the Flamborough centre then broke up the middle before the defence could react and notched his second marker. After the line change Moore got the third Medics goal on a pass from Bramwell.

Flamborough got one goal back, but Kevin Heffron with help from Wheelihan restored the three goal lead for Docs and Dents before the

end of the first frame. Milton completely dominated the game reversing their previous dismal showing in Flamborough. The teams exchanged goals in the last two periods. Darryl Penson, who scored on a pass from Bramwell provided Milton with a 5-2 win.

The Medics, riding the crest of a three game win streak were pitted against league leading Hamilton, in their next contest.

A fast skating, well disciplined Hamilton team struck early and often, building up a 3-0 lead. The Medics gradually got into the game and in the dying seconds of the first period Adam Hearn rapped in a goal with assists going to Jason Ford and Jeremy Robert.

Milton gained their composure in the second and showered Hamilton with shots. Paul Perrott, making his second start in a row, played well, turning Hamilton away at every opportunity. The defensive corps especially the close checking of Craig Hudak and Jed Cosby frustrated the visitors. At the other end Brian Kerwin and Dan Bonham just missed on some close in plays. The game ended 3-1 for Hamilton.

The Docs and Dents moved into a tough part of the schedule facing second place Oakville once and then first place Hamilton twice.

Against Oakville the early story was Perrott. He was sensational, coolly robbing the visitors at every opportunity with his catching glove. Oakville finally scored midway in the second period.

The lead was shortlived as David McFarlane directed a perfect pass from Bramwell past a sliding Oakville netminder. The game continued to be a see-saw affair until late in the third period. At 1:39 remaining Oakville went ahead only to have Moore tie it up seven seconds later on another perfect feed from Bramwell. Unfortunately Oakville came back 29 seconds later to dump Milton 3-2.

The Medics ventured to Hamilton for their next game. Although they lost 3-0 the Milton team showed a lot of poise in playing Hamilton even through the first half of the contest. Milton's top players were Paul Perrott, continuing his strong play in net, and David McFarlane who battled tenaciously along the boards and in the corners.

For the third time in a week Milton was against Hamilton. Unlike the two previous games Milton scored - see REP HOCKEY on page 18
