Last weekend Natalie Clarke of Milton was first overall among females in the Hershey Alpine All-Star Race which took place at Mansfield Ski Club on Saturday. Edith Konstantinov was third overall among females.

The Milton club was represented by their top point scorers in this league, Leslie Grell of Oakville, Konstantinov of Mississauga, Clarke, Greg Workman of Georgetown, Don Antonios of Campbellville and Mark Pearson of Acton.

lost 109-83. The team's top three females were Ellen Powell of Burlington, Cindy Davis of Oakville and Leslie Grell of Oakville, finishing fourth, fifth and sixth overall.

The top three males were Mark Pearson of Acton, Shawn Reynolds of Acton and Jason Baetz of Milton who finished fifth, sixth and seventh respectively.

The day prior the Mackenzie Gold team hosted a two way race against Caledon. Milton Heights won with a score of 126-70. The Gold team's top three females were Kim Douglas of Oakville, Meghan Wright of Burlington and Kathy Shier of Limehouse with a clean sweep of the top spots. "Porter was a big, tough, intimidating team," said Reding coach Ange Polleto. "They went out of their way to push the issue of size and they were good so we had to use speed."

Reding realized they couldn't play the physical game against Porter so they worked their speed game and it turned the momentum around. In the final period Reding outshot their opponents 15-3 but couldn't put the puck in the net.

The tournament was split into a 16 team 'B' Division which Reding played and a six team open division. Reding's Brian Mallany was voted Most Valuable Player in the 'B' Division.

Reding returned from the tournament to play White Oaks (Oakville) in a regular season game. They led 1-0 after the first but a three goal flurry in two and a half minutes put Reding on the ropes.

A quick reply for a 3-2 deficit was recorded by the Royals but a matching marker by White Oaks killed Reding.

The teams exchanged goals again in the 5-3 game. Jim Woods scored a pair for Reding and Caleb Powell had one.

Reding then took on Milton District but were only able to score once while their rivals scored a quartet. The Royals had only 11 men on the bench in the game because of suspensions and prior commitments. Jay Hutton scored their only goal. Rob Crowe, Trevor Thompson, Steve Kaldenback and Brad Pierpoint scored for Milton District.

But Reding got up. They proved they'd only had a slip not a fall as they beat Loyola 3-2 on goals by Chesla, Terry Truman and Joe Piazza.

"They could have nose-dived," said Polleto. "They needed that win or they might have never been able to get their confidence back."

Polleto admitted the team had played too many games in too short a span and that it was wearing them down.

With only three games remaining in the regular season the division has tightened up considerably. Reding has a 7-3-3 record good for 17 points, Oakville Trafalgar has 18 points, White Oaks is tied with Reding at 17 while Appleby College has 15 and Milton District lurks in fifth with 14.
