





PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE MILLSIDE DRIVE RECONSTRUCTION FROM MARTIN STREET TO MAIN STREET

The Town of Milton is planning to reconstruct Millside Drive to a 3 lane urban roadway from Martin Street to Main Street. The works will include pavement widening to provide for a continuous left turn lane, provisions for future traffic signals and possible widening of the Milton Channel struc-

The above project is being planned as a Schedule B undertaking in accordance with the requirements of the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Projects. Subject to comments received as a result of this notice, and the receipt of other necessary approvals, the Town of Milton intends to proceed with the design and construction of this project.

A Public Information Centre will be held at the time and place indicated below. Background information has been assembled and preliminary plans have been prepared. These plans may be seen at the Information Centre where the Town's staff and consultant will be on hand to explain the proposed works, answer questions and receive comments.

If there is no "bump-up" request received by the Minister, the Millside Drive widening will proceed to construction.
